A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing emotional abuse of children and its deleterious effect on all individuals in this Commonwealth.
3	WHEREAS, Dorota Iwaniec, Ph.D, has described emotional abuse
4	as "a persistent, chronic pattern of parental behaviourwhich
5	over the years becomes internalised and gives rise to the
6	feeling that the child alone is to blame"; and
7	WHEREAS, Emotional abuse of children takes many forms and may
8	include rejection, isolation, terrorization, intentional lack of
9	acknowledgment, corruption, verbal assault and overpressure to
10	follow a parent's or guardian's demands; and
11	WHEREAS, Childhood emotional abuse can occur in unexpected
12	environments, perpetrated in homes, foster homes and group homes
13	as well as secure care and criminal justice facilities; and
14	WHEREAS, In 2008, approximately 55,196 children, 7.3% of all
15	substantiated cases of child maltreatment, were victims of
16	childhood emotional abuse; and
17	WHEREAS, This figure may not reflect the full scope of the

1 problem as childhood emotional abuse can be difficult to detect, 2 define and measure, especially across generations; and 3 WHEREAS, Research published in 2001 estimated that 4 psychological maltreatment may have been significantly present 5 in the childhood histories of more than one-third of the general 6 adult population of the United States; and

7 WHEREAS, As a public health issue, childhood emotional abuse
8 bears personal and societal costs; and

9 WHEREAS, Victim-serving organizations consider the lasting 10 effects of emotional abuse, especially childhood emotional 11 abuse, to be the "most damaging form of maltreatment"; and 12 WHEREAS, Survivors may experience lifelong patterns of 13 depression, estrangement, anxiety, low self-esteem, 14 inappropriate or troubled relationships or lack of empathy, and 15 the societal costs are great; and

16 WHEREAS, The economic impact of child abuse and neglect is an 17 estimated \$80.3 billion per year, with \$33.3 billion in direct 18 costs for hospitalization, mental health care and law 19 enforcement, and \$46.9 billion in indirect costs for special 20 education, adult homelessness, criminal justice services and 21 lost work productivity; and

22 WHEREAS, It is important to enact legislation that raises 23 awareness of childhood emotional abuse, makes detection easier, 24 facilitates home visiting and parent mutual support self-help 25 groups and provides proactive mental health services for victims 26 and abusers; and

27 WHEREAS, This type of legislation would break parents and 28 guardians, children and society from the intergenerational cycle 29 of abuse and create a healthier, safer future for Pennsylvania; 30 therefore be it
