- 10 correctable refractive error; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Research shows that adults with healthy vision are
- 12 more productive at work and more socially engaged; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The American Optometric Association (AOA) and
- 14 Optometry Cares® The AOA Foundation are calling upon the
- 15 leaders of this Commonwealth to help all residents become more
