A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to establish an 1 advisory committee to conduct a study of the Commonwealth's 2 current return on investments regarding after-school programs 3 and provide feedback on developing a means to capture 5 outcomes for the purpose of bolstering return on investments for after-school programs. 6 7 WHEREAS, After-school programs offer many opportunities to complement and enhance the academic learning that takes place in 8 school; and 10 WHEREAS, These programs provide strategic enhancements for 11 the engagement of children and youth in a variety of positive 12 social, recreational and academic activities; and 13 WHEREAS, Available resources and access to these 14 opportunities do not exist universally and many poor youths do 15 not have access to after-school programs; and 16 WHEREAS, It is necessary to set up a process to gather 17 statistics and data on the return on investment for after-school programs when looking to find dedicated funding sources from the 18 19 General Assembly is a challenging task due in part to not having

- 2 programs in this Commonwealth; and
- 3 WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the General Assembly to
- 4 govern this Commonwealth in a manner that aids and assists the
- 5 residents of this Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, After-school programs have the power to aid in that
- 7 mission and propel our youth into the future; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 9 State Government Commission to establish an advisory committee
- 10 to conduct a study on the return on investments for after-school
- 11 programs as they relate to the following outcomes:
- 12 (1) the improvement of social, emotional, academic and
- career readiness competencies of school-age children
- including 21st century skill-building;
- 15 (2) the reduction of other negative behaviors such as
- 16 violence and crime, adolescent pregnancies, tobacco, alcohol
- 17 and substance abuse, disengagement from school, school
- 18 suspension and truancy and health-compromising behaviors; and
- 19 (3) providing working families with a safe after-school
- 20 environment for their children and employment opportunities
- 21 in this Commonwealth within the field due to increased
- demand;
- 23 and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission provide
- 25 feedback on the feasibility of the Commonwealth investing in
- 26 after-school programs and track the impact of after-school
- 27 programs in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission
- 29 establish an advisory committee consisting of:
- 30 (1) one police chief;

- 1 (2) one juvenile public defender or district attorney;
- 2 (3) one representative from the Department of Health or
- 3 State Health Improvement Plan Task Force;
- 4 (4) one rural school superintendent;
- 5 (5) one suburban school superintendent;
- 6 (6) one urban school superintendent;
 - (7) one school board member;
- 8 (8) one certified public school teacher;
- 9 (9) one parent of a student enrolled in a public school;
- 10 (10) one individual representing the interests of
- juveniles and of students with disabilities;
- 12 (11) one representative from the Pennsylvania Statewide 13 Afterschool/Youth Development Network;
- in the state of th
- 14 (12) one representative of the Juvenile Justice and
- Delinquency Prevention Committee of the Pennsylvania
- 16 Commission on Crime and Delinquency;
- 17 (13) one representative of the Pennsylvania Department
- 18 of Education;

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- 19 (14) one representative of two Statewide nonprofit
- organizations that offer after-school programs;
- 21 (15) one individual from a qualified 501(c)(3)
- organization that is affiliated and in good standing with a
- 23 national congressionally chartered organization that adheres
- 24 to the organization's standards and provides activities
- designed for recreational, educational and character-building
- 26 purposes for children between 6 and 17 years of age;
- 27 (16) one representative of the State Board of Education;
- 28 (17) one representative who is a youth being served by
- an after-school program;
- 30 (18) one representative who is a director of a

- 1 Pennsylvania after-school program; and
- 2 (19) one representative who is a field staff member of a
- 3 Pennsylvania after-school program;
- 4 and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission report
- 6 to the House of Representatives the result of the study and
- 7 recommendations regarding the return on investments for after-
- 8 school programs in this Commonwealth and file the report with
- 9 the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives no later than
- 10 365 days after adoption of this resolution.
