3	WHEREAS, The military bugle call Taps is our nation's most
4	recognizable bugle call, whose forceful music and use is
5	employed by the United States military at funerals, memorial
6	services and wreath-laying ceremonies; and
7	WHEREAS, The signal of Extinguish Lights at the end of the
8	day was revised by Union General Daniel Butterfield, with the
9	help of his brigade's bugler, Oliver Willcox Norton in July
10	1862, into the music for Taps; and
11	WHEREAS, Taps, also known as "Butterfield's Lullaby," began
12	to be used by other units of the Union Army and may have been
13	used by the Confederates; and
14	WHEREAS, It was made an official bugle call after the Civil
15	War and its mandatory use at military funeral ceremonies dates

1	back to 1891; and
2	WHEREAS, There are no official lyrics to Taps, but the
3	following verses are the most popular:
4	Day is done, gone the sun
5	From the lake, from the hill
6	From the sky
7	All is well, safely rest,
8	God is nigh
