A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating January 15, 2015, as "Krabbe Disease Awareness Day" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Globoid cell leukodystrophy, or Krabbe disease, is
- 4 caused by the shortage of an enzyme called galactosylceramidase;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, The enzyme shortage impairs the growth and
- 7 maintenance of myelin resulting in central nervous system
- 8 disruptions; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The disease affects muscle tone and movement and may
- 10 cause vision and hearing loss, among other devastating effects;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, In most cases, Krabbe disease develops in babies
- 13 before six months of age, although it can occur in older
- 14 children and in adults; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The symptoms of Krabbe disease include feeding

- 1 difficulties, unexplained crying, loss of head control, fevers,
- 2 vomiting, extreme irritability, changes in muscle tone, limb and
- 3 muscle stiffness, poor coordination of movements, seizures,
- 4 progressive loss of hearing and sight, spasticity and loss of
- 5 developmental milestones; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Most children who develop Krabbe disease in infancy
- 7 die before the age of two, most often from respiratory failure
- 8 or complications of immobility and markedly decreased muscle
- 9 tone; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There is no cure for Krabbe disease and treatment
- 11 mainly involves easing symptoms; and
- WHEREAS, Krabbe disease affects about 1 in every 100,000
- 13 people in the United States; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize January
- 15 15, 2015, as "Krabbe Disease Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
