## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of April 2019 as "Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is the second most common
- 4 progressive neurodegenerative disorder after Alzheimer's
- 5 disease; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is estimated to affect
- 7 approximately 1 million people in the United States, and the
- 8 prevalence will rise to 1.2 million by 2030; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is the 14th leading cause of
- 10 death in the United States according to the Centers for Disease
- 11 Control and Prevention; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Life expectancy is reduced for all onset ages, with
- 13 disease progression leading to severe disability and possible
- 14 confinement to a wheelchair or bed prior to death; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The symptoms of Parkinson's disease vary from person

- 1 to person and can include asymmetric tremors, slowness of
- 2 movement and rigidity, difficulty with balance, swallowing,
- 3 chewing and speaking, cognitive impairment and dementia, mood
- 4 disorders and a variety of other nonmotor symptoms; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is estimated that the economic burden of
- 6 Parkinson's disease is at least \$25 billion annually to patients
- 7 and family members which includes direct and indirect costs,
- 8 treatment, social security payments and lost income; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While research suggests the cause of Parkinson's
- 10 disease is a combination of genetic and environmental factors,
- 11 the exact cause and progression of the disease is still unknown;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, There is no objective test or biomarker for
- 14 Parkinson's disease, and there is no cure or drug to slow or
- 15 halt the progression of the disease; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The National Parkinson's Foundation and The Michael
- 17 J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson's Research along with many
- 18 volunteers, researchers, caregivers and medical professionals
- 19 are working to improve the quality of life of individuals living
- 20 with Parkinson's disease and their families and to further
- 21 promote Parkinson's disease awareness, education, knowledge,
- 22 treatment and research; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Further efforts in research, testing and education
- 24 are crucial in order to advance toward improved early detection
- 25 methods, the discovery of more effective treatments to stop the
- 26 progression of Parkinson's disease and, ultimately, to find a
- 27 cure for this devastating disease; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 29 month of April 2019 as "Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month" in
- 30 Pennsylvania; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 2 residents to support the search for a cure and assist those
- 3 individuals and families who deal with this debilitating
- 4 disease.
