A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating April 15, 2015, as "Purple Up! Day" in Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, Since September 11, 2001, more than 30,000
- 3 Pennsylvania National Guard members, reservists and active-duty
- 4 personnel have been deployed in the support of the Global War on
- 5 Terrorism; and
- 6 WHEREAS, An estimate of the number of children in this
- 7 Commonwealth having at least one parent currently serving in the
- 8 National Guard, Reserves or active components of the armed
- 9 forces exceeds 32,000; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Nationwide more than 700,000 children have
- 11 experienced the deployment of one or more parents since 2001;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, More than 40% of military personnel have children
- 14 who are left behind during these deployments; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The month of April has been observed as the "Month
- 2 of the Military Child"; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Defense, armed
- 4 services, cabinet agencies, the White House initiative Joining
- 5 Forces as well as nonprofit organizations, businesses and
- 6 communities throughout our nation join in this observance; and
- 7 WHEREAS, It is fitting that we recognize and honor the
- 8 sacrifices and celebrate the spirit of our men and women in
- 9 uniform; and
- 10 WHEREAS, It is fitting that we let them know that we are
- 11 taking care of their children while they are protecting us; and
- 12 WHEREAS, When parents serve in the military, their children
- 13 serve as well; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Purple, symbolizing all branches of the military, is
- 15 worn as a tribute to our bravely serving men and women;
- 16 therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
- 18 15, 2015, as "Purple Up! Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 20 Pennsylvanians to show support for our military children by
- 21 wearing the color purple on April 15, 2015; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 23 every military installation in this Commonwealth.
