## A RESOLUTION

- Urging the President of the United States and the Congress of the United States to enact H.R. 303 to permit full, concurrent receipt of military retired pay and other veterans compensation, including dependent allowances.
  WHEREAS, American servicemen and servicewomen have dedicated
- 6 their careers to protect the rights we all enjoy; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Career military personnel endure hardships,
- 8 privation, the threat of death, disability and long separations
- 9 from military families in service to our country; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Integral to the success of our military forces are
- 11 servicemen and servicewomen who have made a career of defending
- 12 our great nation in peace and war from the Revolutionary War to
- 13 the present day; and
- 14 WHEREAS, A gross inequity existed in the Federal statutes
- 15 that denied disabled career military personnel equal rights to
- 16 receive veterans' disability compensation concurrent with
- 17 receipt of earned military retired pay; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States passed and the

- 1 President signed H.R. 1588 to remedy this inequity applicable to
- 2 career military personnel dating back to the 19th century; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Retired veterans with a minimum of 20 years were
- 4 denied concurrent receipt of hard-earned military longevity
- 5 retirement pay and veterans' awards for service-connected
- 6 disability; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Career military personnel earn retirement benefits
- 8 based on longevity of 20 years for honorable and faithful
- 9 service and rank at time of retirement; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Veterans' disability compensation serves a different
- 11 purpose from longevity retirement pay and is intended to
- 12 compensate for pain, suffering, disfigurement, chemical
- 13 exposure, wound injuries and a loss of earning ability, with a
- 14 minimum requirement of 90 days of active duty; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The prevailing idea that military retirement pay is
- 16 free is not only misleading but false because there is a
- 17 contribution to retirement pay, calculated to reduce military
- 18 base pay and retirement pay by approximately 7% when pay and
- 19 allowances are computed and approved by the United States
- 20 Congress; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Traditionally, career military personnel receive
- 22 lower pay and retirement than civilian counterparts and have
- 23 invested a life of hardships and long hours without the benefit
- 24 of overtime pay and lack of freedom of expression through
- 25 unions; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Allowances to dependents of veterans with a 30%
- 27 disability are increased with the amount of disability; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The Department of Defense deducts the entire amount
- 29 of dependents' allowances, essentially leaving the disabled
- 30 military retiree with no dependent allowance, a discrimination

- 1 which extends to the families of military retirees; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Current Federal law only authorizes concurrent
- 3 receipt of military retired pay and other veterans compensation,
- 4 including dependents' allowances for a service-connected
- 5 disability rated at 50% or more; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It was unfair to require disabled military retirees
- 7 to fund their own veterans' compensation by deductions on a
- 8 dollar-for-dollar basis in the Department of Defense; and
- 9 WHEREAS, No such deduction applies to similarly situated
- 10 Federal civil service or congressional retirement beneficiaries
- 11 who receive veterans' compensation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The statutory change proposed in H.R. 303 corrects
- 13 this injustice and discrimination to ensure that the United
- 14 States' commitment to national and international goals is
- 15 matched by a similar commitment to those who sacrificed on
- 16 behalf of those goals; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 18 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the President of the United
- 19 States and the United States Congress to immediately enact H.R.
- 20 303 to permit full concurrent receipt of military retired pay
- 21 and other veterans' compensation, including dependents'
- 22 allowances; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 24 the President of the United States, the Secretary of Defense,
- 25 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 26 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
