## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of May 5 through 11, 2019, as "Drinking Water Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, While more than 70% of the earth's surface is
- 4 covered with water, only 1% of that water is suitable for human
- 5 consumption; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Groundwater, the water that soaks into the soil from
- 7 raindrops and moves downward to fill cracks and other openings
- 8 in beds of rock and sand, makes up about 30% of the fresh water
- 9 on earth, not including polar icecaps; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Individual water wells tapping groundwater resources
- 11 provide high-quality water to many homeowners and businesses;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Few people consider water supply when choosing a
- 14 home or when taking a stand on local water supply regulations;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, There are 1,949 municipality-owned or investor-owned

- 1 community drinking water systems providing high-quality water to
- 2 homeowners and businesses; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Federal and State drinking water standards are
- 4 upheld by the Department of Environmental Protection for all of
- 5 those systems; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission regulates
- 7 the rates and service of investor-owned water companies in this
- 8 Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The mission of the Pennsylvania Public Utility
- 10 Commission is to ensure that safe and reliable service is
- 11 provided to ratepayers at a reasonable price; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority
- 13 (PENNVEST) provides low-cost financial assistance for
- 14 infrastructure improvements to community drinking water systems;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, Ongoing cooperation among the Department of
- 17 Environmental Protection, the Pennsylvania Public Utility
- 18 Commission and PENNVEST strengthens drinking water system
- 19 viability, enhances service, increases economies of scale,
- 20 regionally maximizes efficient water supply and use and fosters
- 21 economic development; and
- 22 WHEREAS, A State water plan has been developed to coordinate
- 23 regional, county and local water allocation and use, land
- 24 development planning and related zoning requirements under Act
- 25 220 of 2002; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The American Water Works Association established
- 27 "National Drinking Water Week" more than 40 years ago to call
- 28 attention to water as a precious natural resource; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Water conservation and water quality maintenance are
- 30 essential to this Commonwealth and our nation; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Many of us take for granted the instantaneous
- 2 availability on a 24-hour basis of safe and reliable drinking
- 3 water service provided by viable community drinking water
- 4 systems; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 6 week of May 5 through 11, 2019, as "Drinking Water Week" in
- 7 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage a
- 9 heightened awareness of drinking water treatment, monitoring,
- 10 distribution and related costs and urge all residents of this
- 11 Commonwealth to protect our watersheds, conserve our precious
- 12 drinking water supply and preserve its superior quality.
