A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing May 25, 2019, as "National Missing Children's Day" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Between 1979 and 1981, a series of high-profile
- 4 missing children cases and 29 murders of children and young
- 5 adults in Atlanta, Georgia, brought attention to the lack of
- 6 coordinated efforts among Federal, state and local law
- 7 enforcement to search for missing children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In 1982, the Missing Children Act (Public Law 97-
- 9 292, 96 Stat. 1259) was enacted, allowing information on missing
- 10 children to be entered into the Federal Bureau of
- 11 Investigation's National Crime Information Center database; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 1984, the National Center for Missing and
- 13 Exploited Children (NCMEC) was created; and
- 14 WHEREAS, NCMEC partners with the United States Department of
- 15 Justice to help law enforcement find missing children, eliminate

- 1 child sexual exploitation and prevent child victimization; and
- WHEREAS, According to NCMEC, 424,066 children were reported
- 3 missing in 2018; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Of these cases of missing children, more than 23,500
- 5 were runaways and one in seven were likely victims of child sex
- 6 trafficking; and
- WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania alone, 129 children were reported
- 8 missing; and
- 9 WHEREAS, During the last 35 years, NCMEC's national toll-free
- 10 hotline has received more than 4.8 million calls; and
- 11 WHEREAS, NCMEC has assisted law enforcement in the recovery
- 12 of 290,000 missing children since being founded; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize May 25,
- 14 2019, as "National Missing Children's Day" in Pennsylvania; and
- 15 be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge local
- 17 governments, communities and law enforcement throughout this
- 18 Commonwealth to participate in the protection of children and
- 19 educate children about child abduction and sexual exploitation
- 20 and how to respond and seek help.
