## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of May 2019 as "Lupus Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Every day, an estimated 1.5 million Americans and 5
- 4 million people worldwide struggle with the debilitating
- 5 consequences of lupus, a potentially fatal autoimmune disease
- 6 that can damage any part of a lupus patient's body; and
- WHEREAS, In an autoimmune disease such as lupus, the immune
- 8 system effectively loses its way and, instead of warding off
- 9 foreign invaders like viruses and bacteria, attacks healthy
- 10 cells, causing inflammation and pain and leading to permanent
- 11 damage; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Lupus has no cure and no known cause, and, despite
- 13 the current treatment and available medications, many lupus
- 14 patients have symptoms that cannot be managed well enough for
- 15 patients to lead normal lives, complete their education and

- 1 maintain employment; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Nine out of ten people with lupus are women, and 80%
- 3 of new cases are diagnosed in women between 15 and 44 years of
- 4 age, with the majority of new cases seen in women in their late
- 5 teens and early 20s; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Although the disease is most frequently seen in
- 7 those patients, individuals of any age or gender can develop
- 8 lupus; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Lupus was identified as a disease in 1872, but is an
- 10 underrecognized public health problem that attracts rare
- 11 attention and funding for research for a cure; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Lupus is often referred to as "the disease that
- 13 fools," due to the patient's unawareness of its presence for
- 14 extended periods of time; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Lupus Foundation of America, Philadelphia Tri-
- 16 State Chapter, a nonprofit volunteer health organization with a
- 17 history of service since the early 1970s, provides supportive
- 18 services to the victims of lupus, funds medical research into
- 19 the disease's causes and possible treatments and educates the
- 20 public concerning the realities of lupus; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 22 month of May 2019 as "Lupus Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania to
- 23 give more attention and awareness to the disease.
