A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of June 3 through 7, 2019, as "Child Welfare Professionals Appreciation Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Every day in this Commonwealth thousands of children
- 4 are at risk of child abuse and neglect or have been removed from
- 5 their homes due to abuse and neglect; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania recognizes the need to protect children
- 7 in this Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The task of investigating child abuse, providing
- 9 services to families, assessing safety and ensuring that
- 10 Pennsylvania's children are provided with nurturance, family
- 11 connections and support as they transition into adulthood is
- 12 challenging; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Child welfare professionals in this Commonwealth
- 14 provide services that allow a child to remain safely in their
- 15 home or return home as expeditiously as possible; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The work of child welfare professionals may require

- 1 them to enter into situations in which their personal safety may
- 2 be put at risk; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Child welfare professionals work in difficult and
- 4 emotional situations with children who have been victimized by
- 5 physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and other forms of
- 6 maltreatment; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Child welfare professionals must develop great skill
- 8 in working with families who are in crisis situations,
- 9 struggling with mental health challenges, suffering from drug
- 10 and alcohol conditions, poverty and other difficult issues; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Child welfare professionals must also develop
- 12 substantial knowledge and skills surrounding the rights of
- 13 families, the laws surrounding child welfare and the legal
- 14 processes governing the child welfare system; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Child welfare professionals selflessly undertake the
- 16 endeavor of protecting the children of this Commonwealth, often
- 17 with low pay, long hours, tremendous demands, little
- 18 appreciation and great criticism, all of which has a dramatic
- 19 impact on their personal lives; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Every year child welfare professionals are injured
- 21 or killed in their pursuit to protect children across the United
- 22 States; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Innumerable injuries and deaths of children have
- 24 been averted due to the efforts of our outstanding child welfare
- 25 professionals; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 27 week of June 3 through 7, 2019, as "Child Welfare Professionals
- 28 Appreciation Week" in Pennsylvania.
