A RESOLUTION

- Celebrating the 250th anniversary of the City of Monongahela from August 8 through 11, 2019.
- 3 WHEREAS, The city of Monongahela dates its origin from April
- 4 17, 1769, when William Nowland, Peter Froman and James Linnes
- 5 purchased tracts of land at the mouth of Pigeon Creek on the
- 6 Monongahela River, from a land office in Philadelphia on the
- 7 strength of a 1768 treaty with the Indians; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Originally called Parkinson's Ferry, then
- 9 Williamsport and finally Monongahela City, the town is the
- 10 oldest settlement in the Monongahela Valley; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Monongahela thrived as a transportation center
- 12 supporting thousands of river journeys to the west; and
- WHEREAS, In 1771, Joseph Parkinson and the DeVore brothers
- 14 built and operated competing ferries on opposite sides of the
- 15 Monongahela River; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Monongahela is an Indian word for "falling banks"
- 17 and the city includes two Native American burial mounds; and
- 18 WHEREAS, During the Whiskey Rebellion in 1794, Monongahela

- 1 was the location of a meeting of 226 whiskey rebels held on a
- 2 bluff overlooking the Monongahela River, now known as Whiskey
- 3 Point; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Many buildings in Monongahela, such as the Longwell
- 5 House and the Bethel AME Church, were used as part of the
- 6 Underground Railroad; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Monongahela is the hometown of famed NFL quarterback
- 8 Joe Montana; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Monongahela native, the late Alvin Helfer, is being
- 10 honored as the recipient of the Ford C. Frick Award for
- 11 excellence in broadcasting at Doubleday Field in Cooperstown
- 12 during the Baseball Hall of Fame's 150th anniversary on July 20,
- 13 2019, in Cooperstown, New York; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives celebrate the
- 15 250th anniversary of the City of Monongahela from August 8
- 16 through 11, 2019.
