A RESOLUTION

Commemorating the 30th anniversary of the terrorist bombing of 1 the United States Marine Corps barracks in Beirut, Lebanon. 2 3 WHEREAS, October 23, 2013, will mark the 30th anniversary of the terrorist bombing when 241 members of the armed forces of 4 5 the United States, including 220 members of the United States Marine Corps, were killed; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The terrorist bombing was the deadliest day for the 8 United States Marine Corps since World War II, when the United States Marine Corps fought to secure Iwo Jima; and 9 WHEREAS, The October 23, 1983, attack came in the wake of a 10 multinational intervention striving to restore order and peace 11 12 in a war-torn Lebanon; and WHEREAS, The terrorist bombing was preceded by an April 18, 13 14 1983, terrorist attack involving a car bomb that struck the

United States Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, wounding more than 100 1 2 people and killing 86 people, including 17 Americans, 32 3 Lebanese Embassy employees and 14 embassy visitors and 4 bystanders; and WHEREAS, The families of those brave members of the United 5 6 States Marine Corps continue to mourn the loss of their loved 7 ones who lost their lives during the terrorist bombing; and WHEREAS, Cpl.
