A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing October 26, 2017, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 28 million children in the United States
- 4 have parents who work outside the home, and more than 15 million
- 5 children are left unsupervised after school; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs support working families and
- 7 provide businesses with increased worker productivity; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A 2016 PEAR Institute and iMMAP study found that
- 9 high-quality afterschool programs provide for increased
- 10 identity, understanding and critical thinking skills through
- 11 science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM)
- 12 activities; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In a recent national survey, 52% of parents cited
- 14 cost as a barrier to enrollment in an afterschool program; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Evaluations from 21st Century Community Learning
- 16 Center's programs in this Commonwealth found that students

- 1 experience significant benefits from participating in
- 2 afterschool programs, including improved grades in math and
- 3 language arts/reading, improved academic performance and
- 4 recovery of high school credits or courses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs build stronger communities by
- 6 involving parents, business leaders and student and youth
- 7 volunteers in the lives of young individuals, thereby promoting
- 8 positive relationships among children, youths, families and
- 9 adults; and
- 10 WHEREAS, "Lights On Afterschool Day," founded 18 years ago,
- 11 is a national celebration of afterschool programs that promotes
- 12 the critical importance of afterschool programs in the lives of
- 13 children, families and communities; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
- 15 October 26, 2017, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in
- 16 Pennsylvania.
