1 2 3	Recognizing the accomplishments of Rocco Colavito, Jr., and recommending his nomination to the National Baseball Hall of Fame.
4	WHEREAS, Rocco Domenico Colavito, Jr., known as "Rocky," was
5	born August 10, 1933, in New York City; and
6	WHEREAS, After dropping out of high school at the age of 16
7	to pursue his baseball career, Mr. Colavito was forced to wait
8	one year before signing with the Cleveland Indians in 1951; and
9	WHEREAS, By 1954, he had hit 38 home runs and had amassed 116
10	runs batted in (RBIs) for the Indianapolis Indians; and
11	WHEREAS, In 1955, he finally made his Major League Baseball
12	(MLB) debut for the Cleveland Indians and ended the year tied
13	for American League Rookie of the Year; and
14	WHEREAS, Mr. Colavito quickly made a name for himself as a
15	power hitter and batted a career high .303 in 1958; and
16	WHEREAS, On June 10, 1959, he became the 8th of only 18 MLB

players who have hit four home runs in a single game; and 1 2 WHEREAS, In 1960, to the heartbreak of most Cleveland Indians 3 fans, Mr. Colavito was traded to the Detroit Tigers; and WHEREAS, After a tense three years with the Tigers, he spent 4 one year with the Kansas City Athletics before returning to his 5 6 beloved Indians in 1965; and 7 WHEREAS, He continued with the Indians for two years before 8 playing for the Chicago White Sox, Los Angeles Dodgers and New York Yankees for the next year; and 9 10 WHEREAS, On September 30, 1968, Mr. Colavito was released from the Yankees and retired as a player; and 11 12 WHEREAS, He ended his career with a .266 batting average, 374 home runs and 1,159 RBIs and was named an All-Star nine times; 13 14 and WHEREAS, In the 1970s, he held a variety of roles with the 15 16 Cleveland Indians, and in 1982 and 1983 he was a hitting coach for the Kansas City Royals; and 17 18 WHEREAS, In 2006, Mr. Colavito was inducted into the 19 Cleveland Indians' Hall of Fame; and 20 WHEREAS, Currently, Mr. Colavito resides in Berks County, Pennsylvania, with his wife of almost 65 years; therefore be it 21 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the 23 accomplishments of Rocco Colavito, Jr., and recommend his 24 nomination to the National Baseball Hall of Fame.
