A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing March 18, 2020, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable
- 3 death in the United States, imposing a terrible toll on
- 4 families, businesses and government in terms of health, lives
- 5 and dollars; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Tobacco kills more than 480,000 people annually,
- 7 more than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, illegal drugs, murders
- 8 and suicides combined; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While the United States has made major progress
- 10 against tobacco use, approximately 13.7% of American adults
- 11 still smoke; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In the United States, an estimated 41,000 adults die
- 13 each year from exposure to secondhand smoke; and
- 14 WHEREAS, More than 16 million Americans currently suffer from
- 15 smoking-related illnesses; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Tobacco costs the United States more than \$170

- 1 billion in health care expenditures and \$156 billion in lost
- 2 productivity each year; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Each day, approximately 2,000 youths under 18 years
- 4 of age try smoking for the first time and more than 300 youths
- 5 become new regular, daily smokers; and
- 6 WHEREAS, One in thirteen youths who are regular, daily
- 7 smokers will die prematurely because of tobacco use; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In 2019, approximately 27.5% of high school students
- 9 used electronic cigarettes; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The tobacco industry spends approximately \$9.4
- 11 billion annually or \$25 million each day on marketing its
- 12 products nationwide, with much of the marketing aimed at
- 13 children; and
- 14 WHEREAS, It is imperative that visible, unified tobacco
- 15 cessation and prevention education efforts by community members
- 16 be launched to encourage all tobacco users to become tobacco-
- 17 free; and
- 18 WHEREAS, To win the fight against tobacco, it is imperative
- 19 to prevent teens from starting to use tobacco products, help
- 20 current tobacco users quit and protect all individuals from
- 21 harmful secondhand smoke; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Businesses, government, law enforcement, schools,
- 23 faith-based institutions, service organizations, youths,
- 24 physicians, senior citizens, military organizations, sports
- 25 teams and individuals from all walks of life can demonstrate
- 26 their commitment to tobacco-free, healthy lifestyles by
- 27 participating in "Kick Butts Day"; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize March
- 29 18, 2020, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage

- 1 residents of all ages to participate in tobacco cessation and
- 2 prevention education activities to make a visible show of
- 3 support for our strong commitment to a tobacco-free community,
- 4 encouraging all youths and adults to pledge to be tobacco-free.
