A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of March 2020 as "National Colorectal
- Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer is a type of cancer that starts in
- 4 the colon or rectum, both of which are parts of the large
- 5 intestine and the body's digestive system; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer often begins as an abnormal growth
- 7 called a polyp, which may form on the inner wall of the colon or
- 8 rectum; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In addition to colorectal polyps, risk factors of
- 10 colorectal cancer include increasing age, family history,
- 11 certain genetic mutations, excessive alcohol use, obesity,
- 12 physical inactivity, cigarette smoking and history of
- 13 inflammatory bowel disease; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Symptoms of developing colorectal cancer include
- 15 changes in bowel habits, rectal bleeding, stomach pains or
- 16 cramps, weakness and unexplained weight loss; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of
- 2 cancer-related mortality in the United States, where it is
- 3 expected to cause 53,200 deaths in 2020; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Unprecedented progress has been made in the last
- 5 decade in reducing colorectal cancer incidence and death rates
- 6 largely due to prevention and early detection through screening;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Up to 60% of deaths from colorectal cancer could be
- 9 prevented if everyone 50 years of age or older were screened
- 10 regularly and appropriately treated; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Since 2000, March has been celebrated as "National
- 12 Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month" by advocacy groups, public
- 13 officials, health care providers and patients; and
- 14 WHEREAS, During this month, participants generate widespread
- 15 awareness about colorectal cancer by wearing blue, holding
- 16 fundraising and education events, talking to family and friends
- 17 about screening and so much more; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 19 month of March 2020 as "National Colorectal Cancer Awareness
- 20 Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives join advocates
- 22 nationwide in urging the residents of this Commonwealth to
- 23 follow preventative measures such as:
- 24 (1) Increasing the intensity and amount of physical
- 25 activity.
- 26 (2) Maintaining a healthy weight.
- 27 (3) Quitting smoking.
- 28 (4) Limiting alcohol intake.
- 29 (5) Eating healthy fruits, vegetables and whole grains.
- 30 (6) Reducing the intake of red meat and cutting out

- 1 processed meat.
- 2 (7) Beginning regular screenings at 50 years of age and 3 earlier for those individuals at higher risk.
- 4 (8) Consulting with a doctor about tests for detecting 5 cancer and precancer, such as a colonoscopy, virtual
- 6 colonoscopy, flexible sigmoidoscopy, stool occult blood test,
- 7 stool immunochemical test and stool DNA test;
- 8 and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge its members,
- 10 the Department of Health and health care professionals across
- 11 this Commonwealth to recognize "National Colorectal Cancer
- 12 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania to increase awareness about the
- 13 disease and educate residents on the important preventative
- 14 steps that they can take.
