A RESOLUTION

- 1 Mourning the mass loss of Australian wildlife caused by the bushfire crisis.
- 3 WHEREAS, Approximately 136 bushfires are currently ravaging
- 4 Australia, putting citizens, firefighters and wildlife at risk;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, The fires have been burning since September 2019;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, More than 25 million acres of land, home to various
- 9 wildlife species, have burned; and
- 10 WHEREAS, It is conservatively estimated that more than 1
- 11 billion animals, including 8,000 koalas, have died; and
- 12 WHEREAS, As many as 100 species of plants have been
- 13 classified as threatened due to habitat loss; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Several animal species, including the black-tailed
- 15 dusky antechinus, long-footed potoroo, glossy black cockatoo and
- 16 dunnart, a mouse-sized marsupial, are at risk of extinction; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The fires are undeniably a direct result of the
- 2 worsening effects of manmade climate change and prove the global
- 3 interconnection we all share in this fight; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The potentially permanent loss of wildlife diversity
- 5 affects not only Australia but the entire planet; therefore be
