## A RESOLUTION

- Urging the Department of Health to prioritize the vaccination of corrections staff and incarcerated people since they are at increased risk for contracting and dying from COVID-19. 1 2

- 4 WHEREAS, Incarcerated people have suffered high rates of
- COVID-19 infection because of the nature of close confinement 5
- 6 with others and some serious failings of the enactment of health
- 7 and safety guidelines; and
- WHEREAS, The mortality rate of COVID-19 for incarcerated 8
- people in Federal and state correctional facilities is four
- 10 times as high as the mortality rate for the general population;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, Over the course of the pandemic, more than 12,000
- 13 inmates in Pennsylvania have tested positive for COVID-19 and 76
- 14 have died; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Over half of the inmates at the State Correctional
- 16 Institute Laurel Highlands, which serves as a long-term care
- facility for many older inmates or inmates with medical 17
- conditions, have tested positive for COVID-19 and at least eight 18

- 1 people have died; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Corrections staff are put at increased risk for
- 3 contracting and dying from COVID-19 because of their exposure to
- 4 increased rates of COVID-19 at prisons and other correctional
- 5 facilities; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Outbreaks in prisons that infect corrections staff
- 7 can spread to the surrounding community; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Given that many correctional institutions in
- 9 Pennsylvania are located in rural areas, outbreaks that start at
- 10 correctional institutions and spread to the surrounding
- 11 community through corrections staff can strain the capabilities
- 12 and resources of rural hospitals that have a limited capacity
- 13 because of the high number of existing COVID-19 cases; and
- 14 WHEREAS, While several thousand people have been released
- 15 from correctional institutions to slow the spread of COVID-19 in
- 16 correctional institutions in Pennsylvania, this effort was not
- 17 sufficient to stop the virus and it continues to spread rapidly;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, As of January 11, 2021, there are 2,163 active
- 20 COVID-19 cases among inmates in Pennsylvania and 251 cases among
- 21 staff; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The development and emergency use authorizations of
- 23 COVID-19 vaccines is an important milestone, and the needs of
- 24 incarcerated people cannot be forgotten; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 26 Department of Health to prioritize the vaccination of
- 27 corrections staff and incarcerated people since they are at
- 28 increased risk for contracting and dying from COVID-19.
