A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the observance of the Holy Month of Ramadan, a month 2 of reflection and prayer for the Muslim community, which runs 3
 - from April 23 through May 23, 2020, and the festival of Eid
- al-Fitr. 4
- 5 WHEREAS, Millions of Americans practice Islam; and
- WHEREAS, The Muslim-American population is an extraordinary 6
- mosaic of ethnic, linguistic, ideological, social, economic and
- religious groups; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, In representation of the ninth month of the Islamic
- 10 calendar, Ramadan was established as a holy month for the people
- of the Muslim faith; and 11
- 12 WHEREAS, The Holy Month of Ramadan is celebrated each year
- based on the visual sightings of the crescent moon as the time 13
- 14 the Quran was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad on the occasion
- 15 known as Laylat al-Qadr, the Night of Power; and
- WHEREAS, Observers celebrate the ritual fast known as Sawm, 16
- one of the five pillars of Islam, by fasting from dawn until 17

- 1 dusk, experiencing hunger and thirst as a means of becoming more
- 2 sympathetic, pious and charitable; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Participants during Ramadan devote themselves to
- 4 reflection and the reading of the Quran, the purification of the
- 5 soul and the practice of self-sacrifice; and
- 6 WHEREAS, During the Holy Month of Ramadan, Muslims focus
- 7 fully on devotion and service to God, purging themselves of
- 8 impure thoughts and motivations which are counter to Islam; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The faithful gather in celebration of Eid al-Fitr,
- 10 the Festival of Fast Breaking, at the end of the Holy Month of
- 11 Ramadan, one of the most important holidays in the Muslim world,
- 12 marked with prayer, family reunions and the sharing of generous
- 13 evening meals; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 15 observance of the Holy Month of Ramadan, a month of reflection
- 16 and prayer for the Muslim community, which runs from April 23
- 17 through May 23, 2020, and the festival of Eid al-Fitr.
