A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of May 3 through 9, 2020, as "Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Tardive dyskinesia is a condition of involuntary
- 4 muscle movements of the face, trunk and extremities that can
- 5 vary in frequency and amplitude; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Tardive dyskinesia is a condition that may occur
- 7 with certain medications used to treat mental illness, may
- 8 result from treatment with dopamine receptor blocking agents
- 9 used for both psychiatric and nonpsychiatric conditions and can
- 10 persist even after discontinuing those treatments; and
- 11 WHEREAS, It is estimated that more than 500,000 Americans
- 12 suffer from tardive dyskinesia; and
- 13 WHEREAS, According to the National Alliance on Mental
- 14 Illness, one in every four patients receiving long-term
- 15 treatment with antipsychotic medication will experience tardive
- 16 dyskinesia; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Anyone taking antipsychotic medication may develop

- 1 the condition, but people who are elderly, female, diabetic or
- 2 have a mental illness are at a greater risk; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives believes that it is in
- 4 the interest of Pennsylvania to increase public awareness of
- 5 tardive dyskinesia, a neurological disorder that is
- 6 characterized by repetitive, involuntary muscle movements and
- 7 may occur as a side effect of long-term use of antipsychotic and
- 8 other medications; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 10 week of May 3 through 9, 2020, as "Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness
- 11 Week" in Pennsylvania.
