A RESOLUTION

- Encouraging food donations and recognizing the importance of liability protections under the Bill Emerson Good Samaritan 2 Food Donation Act and the Donated Food Limited Liability Act 3 during the COVID-19 pandemic. 4 5 WHEREAS, Many residents of Pennsylvania are experiencing financial hardships, as well as burdensome worries, relative to 6 the potential effects that the COVID-19 pandemic could have on 7 the health and safety of their friends and family; and 9 WHEREAS, The possibility of contracting COVID-19 is just one 10 of the strains currently placed on many residents located across our Commonwealth and nation; and 11 12 WHEREAS, In addition to experiencing stress and worry relative to the potential health implications related to this 13 14 virus, many residents are also facing growing concerns with
- 16 WHEREAS, For many individuals who are now out of work, the

17 ability to purchase simple necessities may currently be beyond

- 1 their reach; and
- 2 WHEREAS, For some individuals and families, the likelihood of
- 3 facing food insecurity has grown significantly due to the lack
- 4 of a steady and reliable income; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is now more important than ever that individuals
- 6 who are able to weather the current economic storm lend a
- 7 helping hand to those in need; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Given the current circumstances under which many
- 9 individuals and families are now living due to social distancing
- 10 and the widespread closure of businesses as a result of the
- 11 COVID-19 pandemic, providing food donations to nonprofit
- 12 organizations is extremely important; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Many nonprofit organizations located throughout
- 14 local communities of this Commonwealth regularly collect and
- 15 distribute food donations and other essential items to
- 16 individuals and families in need; and
- 17 WHEREAS, These nonprofit organizations not only provide
- 18 necessary food items and goods through charitable acts, but they
- 19 also ease the financial and mental strains of those experiencing
- 20 hardships; and
- 21 WHEREAS, While many nonprofit organizations have the
- 22 capability of providing assistance and goods to local
- 23 communities scattered across Pennsylvania, they too rely on the
- 24 spirit of giving from individuals who are willing and able to
- 25 donate to their cause; and
- 26 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Department of
- 27 Agriculture, before the COVID-19 pandemic began impacting the
- 28 Commonwealth, more than 1.5 million residents of this
- 29 Commonwealth experienced chronic hunger each day; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Since the arrival of COVID-19, Feeding Pennsylvania

- 1 member food banks have reported a significant increase in the
- 2 demand for food assistance throughout their respective
- 3 communities; and
- 4 WHEREAS, When acknowledging the good and charitable efforts
- 5 of nonprofit organizations, it is important to also recognize
- 6 the Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act (Public Law
- 7 104-210, 110 Stat. 3011) and the act of July 10, 1981 (P.L.234,
- 8 No.76), known as the Donated Food Limited Liability Act; and
- 9 WHEREAS, These laws provide protection to individuals who
- 10 donate food in good faith from civil or criminal liability
- 11 related to their food donations; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Because of these legislative measures, individuals
- 13 who are striving to do the right thing by donating food to those
- 14 who are less fortunate are quaranteed a level of protection from
- 15 liability if something should be wrong with a donated food item;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, These laws also provide individuals with a feeling
- 18 of comfort and safety when donating food items to nonprofit
- 19 organizations that are better equipped to collect, process and
- 20 distribute the items to members of their community; therefore be
- 21 it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage food
- 23 donations and recognize the importance of liability protections
- 24 under the Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act and the
- 25 Donated Food Limited Liability Act during the COVID-19 pandemic.
