A RESOLUTION

- Designating the year 2020 as "Frontline Workers Appreciation Year" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The emergence of human-to-human transmission of the
- 4 coronavirus, also known as COVID-19, in late 2019 marked the
- 5 beginning of an ongoing pandemic that poses a serious threat to
- 6 the health and survival of communities all over the world,
- 7 including here in this Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19,
- 9 Governor Wolf signed a declaration of emergency disaster on
- 10 March 6, 2020, and ordered the closure of all non-life-
- 11 sustaining businesses in Pennsylvania on March 19, 2020; and
- 12 WHEREAS, To protect critical infrastructure during a time of
- 13 crisis, essential services are being maintained and operated by
- 14 frontline workers so all Pennsylvanians have access to goods and

- 1 services that are imperative for basic survival; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Frontline workers in the areas of health care,
- 3 grocery and food services, emergency medical services and public
- 4 safety, funeral services and delivery and transportation
- 5 services are taking necessary risks and committing themselves to
- 6 provide essential services during a pandemic so that their
- 7 actions may prevent unnecessary deaths; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Doctors, nurses and other health care workers
- 9 continue to treat patients who have contracted COVID-19, or
- 10 other medical conditions, all while at high-risk for exposure
- 11 and through diminishing and insufficient medical supplies and
- 12 resources so that sick individuals can receive life-saving care;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Grocery and food supply workers, including
- 15 invaluable farm workers, continue to maintain the food supply
- 16 chain despite low wages and going without proper access to
- 17 protective gear so that Pennsylvanians can procure the necessary
- 18 supplies to practice social distancing and quarantine in the
- 19 safety of their own homes; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Emergency medical services providers and first
- 21 responders are often the initial point-of-contact with sick and
- 22 dying patients, enduring long shifts and acute stress on a daily
- 23 basis, to ensure that calls for help do not go unanswered; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Funeral service providers offer a vital and often
- 25 overlooked service that is an essential part of public health,
- 26 especially during a pandemic or any mass-fatality disaster,
- 27 practicing infection control to care for the remains of
- 28 individuals who died of confirmed or suspected COVID-19; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Postal and delivery workers ensure that individuals
- 30 and families practicing social distancing are able to receive

- 1 essential life-preserving items such as food and medicine, as
- 2 well as helping businesses stay financially solvent; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Transportation workers have sustained public transit
- 4 for essential workers and individuals in need of essential goods
- 5 and services who do not otherwise have access to personal
- 6 transport, all amid a lack of basic protections; and
- WHEREAS, In addition to the professions mentioned, there are
- 8 a multitude of frontline workers who continue to make sacrifices
- 9 and who are critical to this Commonwealth's ability to persevere
- 10 through this watershed moment in history, who have only recently
- 11 begun to gain full appreciation but who have always deserved
- 12 recognition and gratitude; and
- 13 WHEREAS, During this public health crisis, when the gravity
- 14 of their presence as frontline workers has never been more
- 15 evident, it is only right to advocate for their needs and safety
- 16 by ensuring that they are provided proper protective equipment,
- 17 hazard pay and fair labor practices; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Acknowledging that recognition and appreciation of
- 19 frontline workers' contributions to this Commonwealth is only
- 20 the first step in thanking our frontline workers for their
- 21 sacrifices; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 23 year 2020 as "Frontline Workers Appreciation Year" in
- 24 Pennsylvania.
