A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of May 2020 as "Better Hearing and Speech Month" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, "Better Hearing and Speech Month" was founded in 3
- 1927 by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association in an
- effort to raise awareness about communication disorders and the 5
- role of audiologists and speech-language pathologists in 6
- 7 providing life-altering treatment; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The American Speech-Language-Hearing Association has
- themed 2020's celebration as "Communication at Work"; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The American Speech-Language-Hearing Association is
- the national professional, scientific and credentialing 11
- 12 association for 211,000 members and affiliates, which includes
- 13 audiologists, speech-language pathologists and other
- 14 professionals in the industry; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Audiologists work with individuals of all ages with
- hearing loss, balance disorders, auditory processing disorders, 16

- 1 tinnitus and other auditory disorders while speech-language
- 2 pathologists help to manage speech, language, voice, swallowing
- 3 and feeding disorders; and
- 4 WHEREAS, In addition to working in clinical settings, these
- 5 professionals also share their knowledge in areas of research,
- 6 education, advocacy, policy development and health
- 7 administration; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Communication disorders are among the most common
- 9 childhood disabilities and are highly treatable in most cases,
- 10 however, many parents may lack awareness of the early warning
- 11 signs and do not recognize the benefits of early treatment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Age-related hearing loss can lead to a wide variety
- 13 of health problems and studies suggest a link between hearing
- 14 loss and cognitive decline; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In adults 50 years of age or older, researchers have
- 16 found that untreated hearing loss increases the risk of
- 17 developing depression by 40% and dementia by 50%; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Early detection and treatment of hearing loss in
- 19 older adults may potentially delay or prevent the onset of
- 20 dementia or cognitive impairment and improve quality of life;
- 21 therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 23 month of May 2020 as "Better Hearing and Speech Month" in
- 24 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 26 residents of this Commonwealth to observe "Better Hearing and
- 27 Speech Month" by evaluating their own communication health as
- 28 well as recognizing and thanking audiologists and speech-
- 29 language pathologists for their contributions.
