A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of March 15 through 21, 2015, as "Sunshine Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The basic principles of freedom of speech and
- 4 freedom of the press guaranteed in the Constitution of the
- 5 United States are fundamental to our national heritage; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Since 2005, the American Society of News Editors
- 7 annually observes Sunshine Week in mid-March, which timing
- 8 coincides with James Madison's birthday on March 16, as a
- 9 nonpartisan, nonprofit initiative to illustrate the importance
- 10 of open government; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Sunshine Week participation by nonjournalism groups
- 12 is growing, with national and local forums planned by civic
- 13 groups, libraries and open government and freedom of information
- 14 groups, as well as by student media; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Sunshine Week was established to spark a discussion

- 1 about the importance of open government and public access to
- 2 government documents and meetings; and
- 3 WHEREAS, These issues are important in this Commonwealth,
- 4 where public access issues emerge all the time; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 6 week of March 15 through 21, 2015, as "Sunshine Week" in
- 7 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That all citizens be urged to join in this
- 9 observance of the basic principles of an open and accessible
- 10 government in a free society.
