## A RESOLUTION

- Designating September 2014 as "Mesothelioma Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mesothelioma cancer is an aggressive, asbestos-
- 4 related disease that affects the linings of the chest, lungs,
- 5 heart and abdomen; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The most common type of mesothelioma is pleural
- 7 mesothelioma, which accounts for approximately 2,500 cases per
- 8 year in the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, It is reported that only 10% to 20% of patients with
- 10 pleural mesothelioma are diagnosed early enough for surgical
- 11 intervention; and
- 12 WHEREAS, While symptoms can vary depending on the area of the
- 13 body where the disease originates, common symptoms of

- 1 mesothelioma are fluid in the chest or abdomen, pain, shortness
- 2 of breath, loss of appetite, heart failure, fatigue, cough and
- 3 weight loss; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Asbestos was used in the construction of most office
- 5 buildings, hospitals, public schools, power plants, automobile
- 6 repair shops, refineries and residential homes built before
- 7 1975; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A high percentage of mesothelioma victims were
- 9 exposed to asbestos on naval ships and in shipyards; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Exposure to asbestos for as little as one month can
- 11 result in mesothelioma 15 years later or longer; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The lack of sufficient research to advance effective
- 13 treatments for mesothelioma has led to inadequate treatment for
- 14 those stricken with the disease and has resulted in a situation
- 15 where the majority of mesothelioma patients die within 12 to 15
- 16 months after diagnosis; and
- 17 WHEREAS, There is no known cure for mesothelioma, leaving the
- 18 only defense to be research and prevention through education;
- 19 therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 21 September 2014 as "Mesothelioma Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania
- 22 to help raise public awareness about mesothelioma and for the
- 23 need to research and discover an effective treatment and a cure
- 24 for this deadly cancer.
