To provide appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 2 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 3 fiscal year July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the 4 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close 5 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020; to provide 6 7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the payment of bills 8 9 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 10 11 30, 2020; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year 12 July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the payment of bills 13 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 14 30, 2020; and to provide for the additional appropriation of 15 Federal and State funds to the Executive and Judicial 16 Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2019, to June 30, 17 2020, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 18 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. 19 20 TABLE OF CONTENTS 21 PART I. - 13 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 14 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 15 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and
- 16 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums
- 17 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 18 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 19 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee
- 20 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,
- 21 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 22 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 23 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 24 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment
- 25 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other
- 26 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for
- 27 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of
- 28 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term
- 29 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 30 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must

- 1 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case
- 2 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that
- 3 provided under the State medical assistance program.

- 19 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the
- 20 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services
- 21 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and
- 22 for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this
- 23 act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions
- 24 and activities and for the purposes specified in this act for
- 25 the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills incurred
- 26 and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior fiscal year.

- 4 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

- 21 use of motor vehicles, the method of making payments from the

- 24 Section 7102. Compliance with other law before funds available.
- No appropriation made by this act to any department, board,

- Funds available to agencies, boards, departments, commissions

- 13 Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.
- 14 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds
- 15 of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in
- 16 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the
- 17 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of

- 19 The appropriation in this act or in any other fiscal year to

- 21 and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon
- 22 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the
- 23 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the
