AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and 6 imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain 7 employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 penalties," in fireworks, further providing for use of 10 consumer fireworks and for penalties. 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Sections 2404 and 2414 of the act of March 4, 14
- 15 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, are
- 16 amended to read:
- Section 2404. Use of consumer fireworks. 17
- 18 (a) Conditions. -- A person who is at least 18 years of age
- and meets the requirements of this article may purchase, possess
- 20 and use consumer fireworks.
- 21 Prohibitions. -- A person may not intentionally ignite or (b)
- 22 discharge:

- 1 (1) Consumer fireworks on public or private property
- 2 without the express permission of the owner.
- 3 (2) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices within, or 4 throw consumer fireworks or sparkling devices from, a motor 5 vehicle or building.
- 6 (3) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices into or at a motor vehicle or building or at another person.
- 8 (4) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices while the 9 person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled 10 substance or another drug.
- 11 (5) Consumer fireworks within 150 feet of an occupied structure.
- 13 (6) Consumer fireworks between the hours of 10 P.M. and
 14 8 A.M. unless during a federally recognized holiday or the
- 15 <u>use is otherwise allowed by a permit issued by the</u>
- 16 <u>municipality in which the consumer fireworks are to be used.</u>
- 17 Section 2414. Penalties.
- 18 The following shall apply:
- 19 (1) A person using consumer fireworks in violation of 20 the provisions of this article commits a summary offense and, 21 upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than
- \$100 for a first offense, \$150 for the second offense and
- \$200 for a third offense or subsequent offense.
- (2) A person selling consumer fireworks in violation of the provisions of this act commits a misdemeanor of the second degree.
- 27 (3) A person selling display fireworks in violation of 28 the provisions of this act commits a felony of the third 29 degree.
- 30 (4) A person selling federally illegal explosives such

- as devices as described in 49 CFR 173.54 (relating to
- 2 forbidden explosives) or those devices that have not been
- 3 tested, approved and labeled by the United States Department
- 4 of Transportation, including, but not limited to, those
- 5 devices commonly referred to as M-80, M-100, blockbuster,
- 6 cherry bomb or quarter or half stick explosive devices, in
- 7 violation of the provisions of this act commits a felony of
- 8 the third degree.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
