13	PENNSYLVANIA IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION
14	Section 2. Chapter 15 of Title 12 is amended by adding
15	sections to read:
16	§ 1501. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
18	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
19	context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 "Account." The Pennsylvania Ireland Trade Commission Account
- 2 established under section 1503 (relating to Pennsylvania Ireland
- 3 Trade Commission Account).
- 4 <u>"Commission." The Pennsylvania Ireland Trade Commission</u>
- 5 established under section 1502 (relating to establishment of
- 6 commission).
- 7 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 8 <u>Development of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 9 <u>"Financial assets." Monetary and other financial gifts,</u>
- 10 grants, donations, bequests, payments and other monetary
- 11 <u>contributions from any source.</u>
- 12 § 1502. Establishment of commission.
- 13 <u>The Pennsylvania Ireland Trade Commission is established</u>
- 14 <u>within the department.</u>
- 15 § 1503. Pennsylvania Ireland Trade Commission Account.
- The Pennsylvania Ireland Trade Commission Account is
- 17 established within the General Fund to accept money, gifts,
- 18 grants and bequests received under section 1510 (relating to
- 19 money, gifts, grants and bequests). The money in the account is
- 20 appropriated on a continuing basis to the commission for the
- 21 commission's administrative expenses.
- 22 § 1504. Membership requirements.
- 23 (a) Appointments. -- The commission shall consist of the
- 24 following members:
- 25 (1) Seven members appointed by the Governor, which shall
- 26 include:
- 27 <u>(i) At least one representative from a public</u>
- institution of higher education.
- 29 (ii) At least one representative from the
- 30 Pennsylvania Chamber of Commerce or a successor

- 1 <u>organization.</u>
- 2 <u>(iii) At least two members representating Irish-</u>
- 3 American communities, neither of whom shall be members of
- 4 <u>the same political party.</u>
- 5 (2) Two individuals appointed by the President pro
- 6 <u>tempore of the Senate.</u>
- 7 (3) Two individuals appointed by the Speaker of the
- 8 <u>House of Representatives.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) Two individuals appointed by the Minority Leader of</u>
- the Senate.
- 11 (5) Two individuals appointed by the Minority Leader of
- 12 <u>the House of Representatives.</u>
- 13 (b) Qualifications. -- All members appointed by the President
- 14 pro tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
- 15 Representatives, the Minority Leader of the Senate and the
- 16 <u>Minority Leader of the House of Representatives shall have</u>
- 17 current or past involvement in organizations that promote Irish
- 18 affairs or have interest in the well-being of trade relations
- 19 between Pennsylvania and Ireland.
- 20 (c) Length of term.--
- 21 (1) The members appointed under subsection (a) (1) shall
- 22 <u>serve for a term of four years.</u>
- 23 (2) Members appointed under subsection (a) (2), (3), (4)
- and (5) shall serve for a term of two years.
- 25 (d) Inital appointments.--Inital appointments to the
- 26 commission shall be made no later than 90 days after the
- 27 <u>effective date of this subsection.</u>
- 28 (e) Vacancies. -- A vacancy in the membership of the
- 29 commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 30 appointment was made.

- 1 (f) Compensation prohibited. -- Members of the commission
- 2 <u>shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for</u>
- 3 expenses actually incurred in the performance of the member's
- 4 duties within the limit of money appropriated to the commission
- 5 or otherwise made available to the commission for its purposes.
- 6 (g) Chair. -- The President pro tempore of the Senate shall
- 7 <u>designate one chair from among the President pro tempore's</u>
- 8 appointments. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
- 9 designate one chair from among the Speaker of the House of
- 10 Representatives' appointments.
- 11 (h) Quorum.--A majority of the members of the commission
- 12 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of
- 13 <u>the commission</u>.
- 14 § 1505. Meetings.
- The commission shall meet quarterly and hold hearings as
- 16 <u>necessary at the places it designates within this Commonwealth.</u>
- 17 § 1506. Applicability.
- 18 The following acts shall apply to the commission:
- 19 (1) The act of July 19, 1957 (P.L.1017, No.451), known
- 20 <u>as the State Adverse Interest Act.</u>
- 21 (2) The act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as
- the Right-to-Know Law.
- 23 (3) The provisions of 65 Pa.C.S. Chs. 7 (relating to
- open meetings) and 11 (relating to ethics standards and
- financial disclosure).
- 26 § 1507. Fiduciary relationship.
- The members of the commission shall stand in a fiduciary
- 28 relationship with the Commonwealth and the commission as to the
- 29 financial assets of the commission.
- 30 § 1508. Powers and duties.

- 1 The commission shall have and may exercise all powers and
- 2 duties necessary or appropriate to carry out and effectuate the
- 3 commission's purposes, including:
- 4 (1) Advance bilateral trade and investment between_
- 5 <u>Pennsylvania and Ireland.</u>
- 6 (2) Initiate joint action on policy issues of mutual
- 7 <u>interest to Pennsylvania and Ireland.</u>
- 8 (3) Promote business and academic exchanges between
- 9 <u>Pennsylvania and Ireland.</u>
- 10 (4) Encourage mutual economic support between
- 11 <u>Pennsylvania and Ireland.</u>
- 12 (5) Encourage mutual investment in the infrastructure of
- 13 <u>Pennsylvania and Ireland.</u>
- 14 (6) For the purposes of defraying the administrative
- 15 <u>expenses of the commission and implementing and administering</u>
- the provisions of this chapter, raise and accept financial
- 17 assets through direct solicitations or other fundraising
- 18 events alone or in conjunction with other persons.
- 19 (7) Adopt bylaws, if necessary.
- 20 (8) Address other issues as determined by the
- 21 commission.
- 22 § 1509. Report.
- 23 The commission shall report its findings, results and
- 24 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly within
- 25 one year of the commission's initial organizational meeting and
- 26 by February 1 of each succeeding year for the activities in the
- 27 preceding calendar year. The report shall be in writing and
- 28 include recommendations as deemed appropriate by the commission
- 29 to effectuate the commission's purposes.
- 30 § 1510. Money, gifts, grants and beguests.

- 1 The commission is authorized to raise money through direct
- 2 <u>solicitation and other fundraising events alone or with other</u>
- 3 groups and accept gifts, grants and bequests from individuals,
- 4 corporations, foundations, governmental agencies and public and
- 5 private organizations and institutions to defray the
- 6 <u>commission's administrative expenses and to carry out the</u>
- 7 <u>commission's purposes.</u>
- 8 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
