AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in COVID-19 Disaster Emergency, providing for Emergency Appropriations for Institutional AND <--3 HOME-BASED Care; IN VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS, FURTHER PROVIDING <--4 FOR FUNDS; and, in grants to fire companies and emergency 5 medical services companies, providing for COVID-19 Crisis 7 Fire Company and Emergency Medical Services Grant Program. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. - 1 The COVID-19 Crisis Fire Company and Emergency Medical
- 2 Services Grant Program is established and shall be administered
- 3 by the agency. Grants provided under the program shall be used
- 4 by fire companies and EMS companies to provide services during
- 5 the novel coronavirus pandemic as identified in the proclamation
- 6 of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 7 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
- 8 the state of disaster emergency.
