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## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 7 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," providing for establishment indoor space 21 22 operation. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 26 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an 27 article to read:

ARTICLE I-A

- 1 ESTABLISHMENT INDOOR SPACE OPERATION
- 2 <u>Section 101-A. Definitions.</u>
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 4 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 6 <u>"Establishment." As follows:</u>
- 7 (1) A restaurant, bar or private club which serves food
- 8 <u>and beverages.</u>
- 9 (2) The term shall not include a night club, music or
- 10 entertainment venue.
- 11 Section 102-A. Operation.
- 12 An establishment with inside seating in existence on the
- 13 effective date of this section may, beginning on the effective
- 14 date of this section, begin operation on the inside seating
- 15 portion of the establishment.
- 16 Section 103-A. Requirements.
- 17 (a) Applicability.--This section shall apply to an
- 18 establishment operating under section 102-A.
- 19 (b) Guidelines.--
- (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), an
- 21 establishment shall follow quidelines issued by the Centers
- for Disease Control and Prevention and the Commonwealth
- 23 <u>regarding business and building operations.</u>
- 24 (2) An establishment may, consistent with guidelines
- 25 issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and
- the Commonwealth regarding business and building operations,
- 27 use suitable barriers in addition to social distancing
- 28 requirements.
- 29 (c) Applicable practices. -- An establishment shall, to the
- 30 extent possible, follow applicable practices of the:

- 1 (1) National Restaurant Association's quidance to help
- 2 <u>restaurants restart operations; and</u>
- 3 (2) United States Food and Drug Administration's Best
- 4 Practices for Retail Food Stores, Restaurants, and Food Pick-
- 5 <u>Up/Delivery Services During the COVID-19 Pandemic.</u>
- 6 (d) Limitation. -- An establishment may not use more than 50%
- 7 of the establishment's seating capacity during operation.
- 8 <u>Section 104-A. Expiration.</u>
- 9 This article shall expire upon termination or expiration of
- 10 the declaration of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
- 11 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020).
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
