## AN ACT

1 2 3	Authorizing counties and municipalities to distribute emergency funds to fire companies during the COVID-19 pandemic; and providing for distribution and receipt of funds.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19
8	Emergency Relief for Fire Companies Act.
9	Section 2. Legislative findings.
10	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
11	(1) A novel coronavirus, known as COVID-19, entered the
12	United States in late January 2020 and has spread throughout
13	the states, including this Commonwealth.
14	(2) On March 6, 2020, the Governor declared a disaster
15	emergency, citing a threat of imminent disaster that is of
16	such a magnitude and severity as to necessitate extraordinary
17	measures to protect the health, safety and life of this
18	Commonwealth's citizens.

(3) On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization
 (WHO) declared COVID-19 a pandemic.

3 (4) In order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the
4 Governor and the Secretary of Health urged the residents of
5 this Commonwealth to adhere to the practice of "social
6 distancing" and to self-quarantine if feeling ill or
7 exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.

8 (5) Consequently, fire companies in this Commonwealth 9 have been unable to conduct fundraising activities as a 10 result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

11 (6) The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, including all 12 the necessary measures taken to mitigate the spread of the 13 disease, has severely disrupted the financial standing for 14 fire companies in this Commonwealth.

15 (7) Due to the unprecedented economic hardships faced by 16 fire companies in this Commonwealth during the COVID-19 17 pandemic, it is imperative that counties are allowed to 18 utilize different fund mechanisms to maintain the operations 19 of fire companies and preserve the health and safety of 20 residents of this Commonwealth.

21 Section 3. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

25 "County." A county or home rule charter county of any 26 classification.

27 "COVID-19 pandemic." The disease that is causing the 2019 28 novel coronavirus outbreak and global pandemic. The term 29 includes the novel coronavirus, coronavirus disease 2019 or 30 2019-nCoV.

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"Declared disaster emergency." The proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.

5 "Fire company." A volunteer fire company or municipal fire 6 company in this Commonwealth.

7 "Municipality." Any of the following:

8

(1) As defined in any of the following:

9 (i) Section 702 of the act of December 18, 1984 10 (P.L.1005, No.205), known as the Municipal Pension Plan 11 Funding Standard and Recovery Act.

12 Section 1(1) of the act of May 12, 1943 (ii) 13 (P.L.259, No.120), entitled "An act providing for the 14 payment by the State Treasurer, of the amount of the tax on premiums paid by foreign casualty insurance companies, 15 16 to the treasurers of the several cities, boroughs, towns, 17 townships, and certain counties, and for the payment 18 thereof into police pension funds, and in certain cases 19 into the Municipal Employes' Retirement System, and for Pension Annuity Contracts, and in certain other cases 20 into the State Employes' Retirement Fund, for certain 21 22 purposes."

(2) A borough, city, town or township.

24 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation, 25 association or organization located in this Commonwealth which 26 provides fire protection services and other voluntary emergency 27 services within this Commonwealth, including voluntary ambulance 28 and voluntary rescue services.

29 Section 4. Emergency distribution of funds to fire companies.30 (a) Authorization.--Notwithstanding any other provision of

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law, in order to mitigate the negative economic consequences of 1 2 the COVID-19 pandemic on fire companies, all of the following 3 may be distributed by a county or municipality to fire companies within their respective jurisdiction: 4

5 Grants distributed by the Office of the State Fire (1)Commissioner for emergency medical services and fire 6 7 services.

8 (2) Grants distributed by the Office of the State Fire 9 Commissioner for fire relief associations.

Notwithstanding Article IX of the act of March 4, 10 (3) 11 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, 12 Chapter 7 of the act of December 18, 1984 (P.L.1005, No.205), 13 known as the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and 14 Recovery Act, and the act of May 12, 1943 (P.L.259, No.120), 15 entitled "An act providing for the payment by the State 16 Treasurer, of the amount of the tax on premiums paid by 17 foreign casualty insurance companies, to the treasurers of the several cities, boroughs, towns, townships, and certain 18 19 counties, and for the payment thereof into police pension 20 funds, and in certain cases into the Municipal Employes' 21 Retirement System, and for Pension Annuity Contracts, and in 22 certain other cases into the State Employes' Retirement Fund, 23 for certain purposes," revenue generated from the tax imposed 24 on foreign fire insurance companies and foreign casualty 25 insurance companies under Article IX of the Tax Reform Code 26 of 1971.

27 (4) Notwithstanding 4 Pa.C.S. Ch. 14 (relating to 28 revenues), revenue distributed to the county or municipality 29 from the State Gaming Fund.

30 Notwithstanding 58 Pa.C.S. Ch. 23 (relating to (5) 20200SB1163PN1710 - 4 -

1 unconventional gas well fee), revenue distributed to the 2 county or municipality from the unconventional gas well fee. 3 (6) Any other funding sources to fire companies within the county or municipality. 4 (b) Prohibition.--A county may not utilize any of the 5 following under subsection (a): 6 7 Federal funds appropriated to the Commonwealth for a (1)specific purpose. 8 9 Funds designated for a specific purpose in a (2) 10 contract or agreement executed by the county before the effective date of this act. 11 12 (3) Funds designated for a specific purpose in a 13 contract or agreement between a Commonwealth entity and a 14 fire company. Section 5. Distribution and receipt of funds. 15 16 Authorization. -- A county or municipality may distribute (a) the funds under section 4(a) to fire companies within the county 17 18 or municipality for any of the following: 19 The payment of utility bills. (1)20 The payment of mortgage or rent expenses. (2)21 Any other bill or expenses necessary to maintain the (3) 22 fire service of fire companies. 23 (b) Receipt.--A county or municipality that utilizes the 24 funds under section 4(a) shall distribute the funds to fire 25 companies within the county or municipality on a first-come, 26 first-served basis. 27 Section 6. Expiration. 28 This act shall expire on the same date as the termination or 29 expiration of the declared disaster emergency. Section 7. Effective date. 30 20200SB1163PN1710 - 5 -
