## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), entitled "An act requiring the licensing of practitioners of 2 osteopathic medicine and surgery; regulating their practice; 3 providing for certain funds and penalties for violations and 4 repeals," further providing for qualifications for license. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 6 of the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice 10 Act, is amended by adding a subsection to read: Section 6. Oualifications for license. 11 12 13 (b.1) The following shall apply: 14 (1) An applicant for an initial license to practice 15 medicine and surgery without restriction in this Commonwealth 16 shall request and submit to the board the results of a 17 national criminal history record check. The purpose of the 18 national criminal history record check shall be to assist the board in obtaining information that may relate to the 19

1 <u>applicant's fitness for licensure.</u>

2 (2) An applicant for an initial license to practice

3 <u>medicine and surgery shall submit to fingerprinting by the</u>

4 <u>Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent of the</u>

5 <u>Pennsylvania State Police. The Pennsylvania State Police or</u>

an authorized agent shall submit the fingerprints to the

7 <u>Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purposes of obtaining</u>

records of criminal arrests and convictions.

(3) An applicant requesting that the Commonwealth act as the State of Principal License in accordance with the act of October 26, 2016 (P.L.891, No.112), known as the Interstate

Medical Licensure Compact Act, shall submit to fingerprinting by the Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent of the Pennsylvania State Police. The Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent shall submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purposes of obtaining records of criminal arrests and convictions to verify eligibility under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Act. This paragraph shall not be construed to permit records obtained by the national criminal history record check to be submitted to the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact.

(4) In addition to the application fee, the applicant shall be responsible for any fees required by the

Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent for the costs of the fingerprinting and the costs of conducting a complete criminal history record check. The applicant shall authorize the release of all records obtained by the criminal history record check to the board.

(5) A criminal history record check submitted in support of an application for licensure must have been requested by

- 1 <u>the applicant no earlier than 12 months immediately prior to</u>
- 2 <u>the board's receipt of the applicant's application for</u>
- 3 <u>licensure.</u>
- 4 (6) Information obtained from the criminal history
- 5 <u>record check:</u>
- 6 <u>(i) Is confidential.</u>
- 7 <u>(ii) May not be redisseminated.</u>
- 8 <u>(iii) May be used only for the licensing purpose</u>
- 9 <u>authorized by this act.</u>

- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
