AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the reopening of food and beverage service
- 2 establishments through a phase-in period in relation to the
- 3 COVID-19 emergency declaration; and providing for enforcement
- 4 by the Department of Health.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Food and
- 9 Beverage Service Establishment Reopening Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "COVID-19 emergency declaration." The proclamation of
- 15 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 16 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
- 17 the state of disaster emergency.
- 18 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Establishment." A person engaged in the business of selling
- 2 or offering for sale food or beverages at retail in this
- 3 Commonwealth. The term includes a restaurant, bar or similar
- 4 establishment.
- 5 "Nonrelated customers." Individuals who request service at
- 6 an establishment and either are not family members or do not
- 7 share a common dwelling as their residence.
- 8 "Occupancy or seating capacity." The number of individuals
- 9 who may occupy or be seated in a specific establishment as
- 10 approved by law prior to the COVID-19 emergency declaration.
- 11 Section 3. Reopening of establishments.
- 12 (a) General rule. -- Notwithstanding the COVID-19 emergency
- 13 declaration, the Governor's 20200319 TWW COVID-19 Business
- 14 Closure Order or any other executive order to the contrary,
- 15 establishments may be open for business provided they comply
- 16 with the phase-in schedule under subsection (b) and the health
- 17 and safety provisions under subsection (c).
- 18 (b) Phase-in schedule.--An establishment that is open for
- 19 business during the time period covered by the COVID-19
- 20 emergency declaration shall comply with the following phase-in
- 21 schedule for occupancy or seating capacity:
- 22 (1) Beginning on the effective date of this section, the
- establishment may not operate in excess of 25% of its
- 24 occupancy or seating capacity.
- 25 (2) Beginning two weeks after the effective date of this
- section, the establishment may not operate in excess of 50%
- of its occupancy or seating capacity.
- 28 (3) Beginning four weeks after the effective date of
- this section, the establishment may not operate in excess of
- 30 75% of its occupancy or seating capacity.

- 1 (4) Beginning six weeks after the effective date of this
- 2 section, the establishment may not operate in excess of 100%
- 3 of its occupancy or seating capacity.
- 4 (c) Health and safety provisions. -- An establishment that is
- 5 open for business during the time period covered by the COVID-19
- 6 emergency declaration shall comply with the following
- 7 provisions:
- 8 (1) The establishment shall comply with the social
- 9 distancing practices and other mitigation measures defined by
- 10 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, to protect
- 11 workers and to mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 virus, as
- well as the guidelines by the United States Department of
- 13 Labor Occupational Safety and Health Administration.
- 14 (2) Unless otherwise required under paragraph (1), an
- 15 establishment shall ensure that nonrelated customers are
- seated and served six feet apart consistent with social
- 17 distancing protocols.
- 18 Section 4. Enforcement.
- 19 The department shall enforce compliance with this act.
- 20 Section 5. Expiration.
- 21 This act shall expire upon termination or expiration of the
- 22 COVID-19 emergency declaration under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c)
- 23 (relating to general authority of Governor).
- 24 Section 6. Publication of notice.
- 25 (a) General rule. -- Within seven days of the termination or
- 26 expiration of the COVID-19 emergency declaration under 35
- 27 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to general authority of Governor),
- 28 the department shall submit a notice of the termination or
- 29 expiration to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
- 30 in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

- 1 (b) Nonapplicability. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply if the
- 2 Governor or another agency has previously submitted the same or
- 3 similar notice relating to the COVID-19 emergency declaration.
- 4 Section 7. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect immediately.
