AN ACT

- Providing for certain civil immunity relating to COVID-19 exposure and for limitation of time to bring suit.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19
- 7 Exposure Liability Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Business services." Any lawful activity conducted by a
- 13 trade, business or not-for-profit organization.
- "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
- 15 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
- 16 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
- 17 China.
- 18 "COVID-19 emergency declaration." The proclamation of

- 1 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 2 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
- 3 the state of disaster emergency.
- 4 "Gross negligence." An act or omission:
- 5 (1) that, when viewed from the standpoint of the actor
- at the time of its occurrence, involves an extreme degree of
- 7 risk, considering the probability and magnitude of the
- 8 potential harm to others; and
- 9 (2) of which the actor has actual, subjective awareness
- of the risk involved, but nevertheless proceeds with
- 11 conscious indifference to the rights, safety or welfare of
- 12 others.
- "Premises." A building, structure, dwelling or real property
- 14 that may be entered or used by persons for business, public use,
- 15 lodging or the storage of goods, including a vehicle, aircraft
- 16 or watercraft used for the lodging of persons or carrying on of
- 17 business.
- 18 Section 3. Civil immunity.
- 19 A person that attempts, in good faith, to adhere to the
- 20 COVID-19 emergency declaration, the Governor's 20200319 TWW
- 21 COVID-19 Business Closure Order or any other executive order
- 22 relating to COVID-19, or any guidance issued by the Department
- 23 of Health or the Secretary of Health relating thereto, shall not
- 24 be liable for damages, injury or death resulting from or related
- 25 to actual or alleged exposure to COVID-19 in the course of or
- 26 through the performance or provision of business services absent
- 27 clear and convincing evidence of gross negligence.
- 28 Section 4. Limitation of time.
- 29 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a
- 30 person must bring suit for an alleged injury resulting from

- 1 exposure to COVID-19 not later than one year after the date the
- 2 cause of action accrues.
- 3 Section 5. Construction.
- 4 Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- 5 (1) Create a new cause of action or expand any liability
- 6 otherwise imposed, limit any defense or affect the
- 7 applicability of any law that affords greater protections to
- 8 defendants than are provided in this act.
- 9 (2) Preclude an otherwise valid claim for worker's
- 10 compensation benefits or collateral source payment under
- 11 State law.
- 12 Section 6. Expiration.
- 13 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided in
- 14 subsection (b), this act shall expire two years after the COVID-
- 15 19 disaster declaration is terminated or expires under 35
- 16 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to general authority of Governor).
- 17 (b) Exception. -- Any civil liability arising out of an act or
- 18 omission or related to an injury that occurred during the
- 19 operation of this act shall be subject to the provisions of this
- 20 act in perpetuity.
- 21 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
