AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance, further providing for reports to General Assembly.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 437 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
8	No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended to read:
9	Section 437. Reports to General Assembly <u>(a)</u> Two copies
10	of all reports required by the national center for social
11	statistics of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare
12	shall be furnished to the Senate Public Health and Welfare
13	Committee and the Health and Welfare Committee of the House of
14	Representatives when they are submitted to the Federal
15	Government. Similar reports prepared concerning general
16	assistance, the State Blind Pension and State supplemental
17	assistance shall be similarly furnished to the committees.
18	(b) The department shall also issue an annual report to the

1	<u>chairperson and minority chairperson of the Health and Human</u>
2	Services Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and
3	minority chairperson of the Human Services Committee of the
4	House of Representatives that includes the following
5	information:
6	(1) Details on information relating to the changes in how
7	lottery winnings are counted for all forms of cash assistance,
8	including the following:
9	(i) Details on how many applicants reported lottery winnings
10	<u>of six hundred dollars (\$600) or more.</u>
11	(ii) Details on how many of those applicants were denied
12	assistance due to lottery winnings of six hundred dollars (\$600)
13	<u>or more.</u>
14	(iii) Details on any potential gaps in communication
15	encountered between the department and county assistance offices
16	which may have resulted in the failed reporting of winnings of
17	<u>six hundred dollars (\$600) or more.</u>
18	(iv) Details regarding ongoing strategies between the
19	department and the Pennsylvania State Lottery in carrying out
20	the program.
21	(2) Details on how many vehicles were exempted in total as a
22	result of the provisions covered under this article.
23	(3) Details on the average equity value of vehicles counted
24	<u>as resources for all recipients.</u>
25	(4) Details on information regarding replacement access
26	devices, including the following:
27	(i) Details on how many recipients requested a replacement
28	access device under section 485(a).
29	(ii) Details on how many additional access devices were
30	issued under section 485(b) and (b.1).

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1	(iii) Details on how many times the fee for replacement
2	<u>access devices was overridden.</u>
3	(iv) Details on how many recipients were reported to the
4	Office of Inspector General for requesting two or more
5	<u>replacement access devices in a calendar year.</u>
6	(5) Details on how many instances recipients attempted to
7	make purchases or withdraw funds in violation of section 484.
8	(6) Details highlighting any changes in reports from
9	previous years.
10	(7) Any recommendations that the department wants to make to
11	the General Assembly to improve carrying out this article.
12	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
