AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain 2
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for COVID-19 pandemic of 2020. 5

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 8
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1501.9. COVID-19 Pandemic of 2020.--(a) This
- section applies only to the school year 2019-2020 as a result of 13
- the global pandemic declared by the World Health Organization on 14
- 15 March 11, 2020.
- 16 (b) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
- 17 the following shall apply:
- 18 (1) An eligible provider of the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts
- 19 Program or a Head Start agency or delegate agency providing the

- 1 Head Start Supplemental Assistance Program shall continue to
- 2 receive payments from the department as they would otherwise be
- 3 entitled to receive for the fiscal year 2019-2020 had the
- 4 pandemic of 2020 not occurred, including if the program is
- 5 <u>closed or has lower attendance due to the pandemic of 2020.</u>
- 6 (2) The department shall issue payments to an eliqible
- 7 provider of the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts Program or a Head
- 8 Start agency or delegate agency providing the Head Start
- 9 <u>Supplemental Assistance Program for an additional twenty (20)</u>
- 10 days of instruction for children who will enter kindergarten in
- 11 the 2020-2021 school year as a result of the pandemic of 2020.
- 12 (3) Every eligible provider of the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts
- 13 Program or a Head Start agency or delegate agency providing the
- 14 <u>Head Start Supplemental Assistance Program shall have a minimum</u>
- 15 of two (2) staff persons participate in a training on the best
- 16 practices for sanitization related to the pandemic of 2020 and
- 17 <u>sanitize their program prior to reopening. Training shall be:</u>
- 18 <u>(i) Offered at no cost.</u>
- 19 (ii) Credit bearing.
- 20 (iii) Approved or offered by the Department of Education, in
- 21 consultation with the Department of Health and the Department of
- 22 Human Services.
- 23 (4) Every eligible provider of the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts
- 24 Program or a Head Start agency or delegate agency providing the
- 25 <u>Head Start Supplemental Assistance Program with children</u>
- 26 enrolled as of March 13, 2020, shall be issued a payment of
- 27 forty dollars (\$40) per child, to assist with the costs of
- 28 reopening, including sanitization, meeting COVID-19 public
- 29 health requirements and standards, providing supplies and
- 30 training.

- 1 (5) The sum of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000), or as
- 2 <u>much thereof as may be necessary</u>, is appropriated from the
- 3 General Fund to the Department of Education for the fiscal year
- 4 July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, for the purpose of funding the
- 5 <u>Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts Program and Head Start Supplemental</u>
- 6 <u>Assistance Program.</u>
- 7 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 9 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Eliqible provider." As defined in paragraphs (1), (2) and
- 11 (3) of the definition of "eligible provider" in section 1511-D.
- 12 <u>"Head Start agency or delegate agency." As used in section</u>
- 13 <u>1501-D</u>, except for an agency or delegate agency that provides
- 14 child care under section 901 of the act of June 13, 1967
- 15 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, or is a child
- 16 care center under section 1001 of the Human Services Code.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
