AN ACT

- 1 Providing for essential family caregivers in facilities during 2 disaster emergencies.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Essential
- 7 Family Caregiver Designation Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Communicable disease." As defined in section 2(c) of the
- 13 act of April 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1510, No.500), known as the
- 14 Disease Prevention and Control Law of 1955.
- 15 "COMPASSIONATE CARE SITUATION." ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 16 (1) AN END OF LIFE SITUATION.
- 17 (2) A RESIDENT STRUGGLING WITH THE CHANGE IN ENVIRONMENT

- 1 AND LACK OF PHYSICAL FAMILY SUPPORT WHO WAS LIVING WITH
- 2 FAMILY BEFORE BEING RECENTLY ADMITTED TO A FACILITY.
- 3 (3) A RESIDENT WHO IS GRIEVING AFTER A FRIEND OR FAMILY
- 4 MEMBER RECENTLY PASSED AWAY.
- 5 (4) A RESIDENT WHO IS EXPERIENCING WEIGHT LOSS OR
- 6 DEHYDRATION AND NEEDS CUEING AND ENCOURAGEMENT WITH EATING OR
- 7 DRINKING WHICH WAS PREVIOUSLY PROVIDED BY A FAMILY MEMBER OR
- 8 CAREGIVER.
- 9 (5) A RESIDENT WHO IS EXPERIENCING EMOTIONAL DISTRESS,
- 10 IS SELDOM SPEAKING OR CRYING MORE FREQUENTLY AND WHO USED TO
- 11 TALK AND INTERACT WITH OTHERS.
- 12 "Essential family caregiver." As follows:
- 13 (1) Any of the following individuals who are at least 18
- 14 years of age and who, prior to visitor restrictions, were
- regularly engaged with a resident at least once per week:
- 16 (i) An immediate family member.
- 17 (ii) A caregiver of the resident who is not employed
- 18 by a facility.
- 19 (2) The term does not include an employee of a
- 20 regulatory agency unless the employee is an immediate family
- 21 member of the resident.
- 22 "Facility." Any of the following:
- 23 (1) A long-term care nursing facility as defined in
- 24 section 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48),
- 25 known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 26 (2) A hospice as defined in section 802.1 of the Health
- 27 Care Facilities Act, if the hospice renders care in an
- 28 <u>inpatient setting.</u>
- (3) (1) An assisted living residence as defined in
- 30 section 1001 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21),

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- 1 known as the Human Services Code.
- 2 (4) (2) A personal care home as defined in section 1001 <--
- 3 of the Human Services Code.
- 4 (5) (3) An intermediate care facility for individuals <--
- 5 with an intellectual disability.
- 6 "Immediate family member." A spouse, child, stepchild,
- 7 parent, stepparent, grandparent, grandchild, brother,
- 8 stepbrother, sister, stepsister or like relative-in-law.
- 9 "Intermediate care facility for individuals with an
- 10 intellectual disability." The term shall have the same meaning
- 11 as the term "intermediate care facility for the mentally
- 12 retarded" in section 1905(d) of the Social Security Act (49
- 13 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(d)) on the effective date of this
- 14 definition.
- 15 "Secretary." The Secretary of Health or the Secretary of <--
- 16 Human Services of the Commonwealth.
- "State of disaster emergency." A state of disaster emergency
- 18 declared under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to general
- 19 authority of Governor) that is due to a communicable disease.
- 20 Section 3. Essential family caregiver.
- 21 (a) Designation. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 22 law, during a state of disaster emergency the secretary shall
- 23 allow REQUIRE a facility to designate at least one essential
- 24 family caregiver per resident to provide companionship and
- 25 assist with activities requiring one-on-one direction, INCLUDING <--

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- 26 COMPASSIONATE CARE SITUATIONS. Only facilities that have the
- 27 ability to follow necessary precautions outlined by the Federal
- 28 and State Government may designate an essential family
- 29 caregiver.
- 30 (b) Individualization and integration. The decision to

- 1 designate an essential family caregiver may be individualized
- 2 and integrated with resident centered care planning. The
- 3 following shall apply:
- 4 (1) Designation shall be at the sole discretion of the
- 5 <u>facility executive director or designee and only upon</u>
- 6 agreement by the resident and their representative.
- 7 (2) A schedule and the amount of time allowed in a
- 8 facility by an essential family caregiver shall be agreed to
- 9 prior to an essential family caregiver entering a facility
- and may not exceed more than two hours per day.
- 11 (3) An essential family caregiver shall provide care and
- 12 support similar in nature as provided prior to the state of
- 13 <u>disaster emergency.</u>
- 14 (4) Physical distancing shall be maintained by an-
- 15 essential family caregiver with staff and other residents-
- 16 while in the facility.
- 17 (5) An essential family caregiver shall adhere to any
- 18 conditions specified by the facility.
- (6) Restriction or revocation of essential family
- 20 caregiver status shall be at the sole discretion of the
- 21 <u>facility executive director or designee.</u>
- 22 (B) VISITATION.--VISITATION BY AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER <--
- 23 MAY BE CONDUCTED THROUGH DIFFERENT MEANS BASED ON A FACILITY'S
- 24 STRUCTURE AND THE NEEDS OF THE RESIDENTS, SUCH AS USE OF
- 25 RESIDENT ROOMS, DEDICATED VISITATION SPACES AND THE OUTDOORS AND
- 26 VISITATION IN CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND COMPASSIONATE CARE
- 27 SITUATIONS. THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:
- 28 (1) EXCEPT FOR ON-GOING USE OF VIRTUAL VISITS,
- 29 FACILITIES MAY STILL RESTRICT VISITATION BY AN ESSENTIAL
- 30 FAMILY CAREGIVER DUE TO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 (I) A COVID-19 COUNTY POSITIVITY RATE GREATER THAN
- 2 10% ACCORDING TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
- 3 AND HUMAN SERVICES CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID
- 4 SERVICES.
- 5 (II) THE FACILITY'S COVID-19 STATUS.
- 6 (III) A RESIDENT'S COVID-19 STATUS.
- 7 (IV) VISITOR SYMPTOMS.
- 8 (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1), A FACILITY
- 9 MAY NOT RESTRICT VISITATION BY AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER
- 10 WITHOUT A REASONABLE CLINICAL OR SAFETY CAUSE.
- 11 (C) ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER REQUIREMENTS. -- THE DECISION
- 12 TO DESIGNATE AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER MAY BE INDIVIDUALIZED
- 13 AND INTEGRATED WITH RESIDENT-CENTERED CARE PLANNING. A VISIT
- 14 SHALL BE HELD OUTDOORS WHENEVER PRACTICABLE. FOR INSIDE VISITS,
- 15 THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:
- 16 (1) DESIGNATION SHALL BE BY THE FACILITY EXECUTIVE
- 17 DIRECTOR OR EQUIVALENT POSITION OR DESIGNEE, IN CONSULTATION
- 18 WITH THE RESIDENT AND THE RESIDENT'S REPRESENTATIVE, AND ONLY
- 19 UPON AGREEMENT BY THE RESIDENT AND THEIR REPRESENTATIVE.
- 20 (2) A SCHEDULE AND THE AMOUNT OF TIME ALLOWED IN A
- 21 FACILITY BY AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER SHALL BE AGREED TO
- 22 PRIOR TO AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER ENTERING A FACILITY
- 23 AND MAY NOT EXCEED MORE THAN TWO HOURS PER DAY.
- 24 (3) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW,
- 25 VISITATION SHALL BE CONTINGENT UPON THE FACILITY HAVING NO
- 26 NEW COVID-19 CASES IN THE LAST 14 DAYS. NO FACILITY MAY
- 27 CONDUCT VISITATION DURING THE TIME PERIOD THE FACILITY IS
- 28 CONDUCTING OUTBREAK TESTING.
- 29 (4) ALL WHO ENTER THE FACILITY MUST BE SCREENED FOR
- 30 SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 AND THE DENIAL OF ENTRY OF

- 1 THOSE WITH SIGNS OR SYMPTOMS MUST OCCUR.
- 2 (5) PROPER HAND HYGIENE MUST BE IMPLEMENTED.
- 3 (6) THE WEARING OF A FACE COVERING OR MASK COVERING BOTH
- 4 THE MOUTH AND NOSE MUST BE ENFORCED.
- 5 (7) PHYSICAL DISTANCING AT LEAST SIX FEET BETWEEN
- 6 INDIVIDUALS SHALL BE MAINTAINED BY AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY
- 7 CAREGIVER WITH STAFF AND OTHER RESIDENTS WHILE IN THE
- 8 FACILITY.
- 9 (8) AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER SHALL PROVIDE CARE AND
- 10 SUPPORT SIMILAR IN NATURE AS PROVIDED PRIOR TO THE
- 11 PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR ON
- 12 MARCH 6, 2020, PUBLISHED AT 50 PA.B. 1644 (MARCH 21, 2020),
- AND ANY RENEWAL OF THE STATE OF DISASTER EMERGENCY.
- 14 (9) AN ESSENTIAL FAMILY CAREGIVER SHALL ADHERE TO ANY
- 15 CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE FACILITY.
- 16 (10) RESTRICTION OR REVOCATION OF ESSENTIAL FAMILY
- 17 CAREGIVER STATUS SHALL BE AT THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE
- 18 FACILITY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR EQUIVALENT POSITION OR
- 19 DESIGNEE.
- 20 Section 4. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect immediately.
