AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1
- act relating to the public school system, including certain 2
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for pandemic instruction. 5

- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- section to read: 11
- 12 Section 1529. Pandemic Instruction .-- (a) Beginning with the
- 13 2020-2021 school year and each school year thereafter, each
- public school student shall receive mandatory instruction on the 14
- 15 types of pandemics, the impact of a pandemic and the aftermath
- 16 of a pandemic, in grades kindergarten through twelve.
- 17 (b) Each school entity shall:
- 18 (1) Develop age-appropriate pandemic instruction and
- integrate the instruction into the school entity's existing 19

- 1 courses of study for students in grades kindergarten through
- 2 twelve. The instruction developed by the school entity shall
- 3 include the requirements of pandemic instruction under
- 4 <u>subsections (e) and (f).</u>
- 5 (2) Include training in pandemic instruction in the
- 6 professional development plan submitted by the school entity to
- 7 the secretary for approval in accordance with section 1205.1.
- 8 The training included in the school entity's plan for an employe
- 9 required to complete continuing professional education shall
- 10 provide up to four (4) hours every five (5) years toward the
- 11 continuing professional education requirements.
- 12 <u>(c) In consultation with at least one (1) organization</u>
- 13 knowledgeable on different types of pandemics and the long-term
- 14 and sustained changes that occur in a population from the impact
- 15 of a pandemic, the department shall:
- 16 (1) Develop age-appropriate model curriculum for instruction
- 17 on pandemics for each grade from kindergarten through twelve,
- 18 which curriculum may include materials already publicly
- 19 available, no later than twelve (12) months after the effective
- 20 date of this subsection.
- 21 (2) Make available the model curriculum and other age-
- 22 appropriate materials to a school entity and post the model
- 23 curriculum on the publicly accessible Internet website of the
- 24 department.
- 25 (3) Recommend guidelines and educational materials for the
- 26 training provided under subsection (b)(2), which may include
- 27 <u>materials already publicly available, not later than twelve (12)</u>
- 28 months after the effective date of this subsection.
- 29 (4) Revise the model curriculum and guidelines on pandemics
- 30 as necessary to ensure the use of the most current information

- 1 and universally accepted social policies related to pandemics,
- 2 the impact of a pandemic and the aftermath of a pandemic.
- 3 (d) In developing model curriculum under subsection (c), as
- 4 appropriate, the department shall include:
- 5 (1) Requirements for pandemic instruction under subsection
- 6 <u>(f).</u>
- 7 (2) Actions to take during a pandemic and how to maintain a
- 8 <u>healthy well-being throughout a pandemic.</u>
- 9 <u>(3) Pandemic preparedness.</u>
- 10 (4) Plans and essentials for pandemics.
- 11 (5) Efforts for the prevention of harm and the spread of
- 12 <u>harm throughout a pandemic.</u>
- 13 (6) Impacts of severe economic hardship that a pandemic can
- 14 <u>have around the world.</u>
- 15 (7) Policies that could be implemented to mitigate the
- 16 <u>impacts and damage of a pandemic.</u>
- 17 (e) In developing and implementing the instruction in
- 18 accordance with subsection (b)(1), a school entity may utilize:
- 19 (1) Appropriate public or private materials, personnel and
- 20 other resources.
- 21 (2) Model curriculum developed by the department in
- 22 accordance with subsection (c).
- 23 (3) Other published curriculum that complies with the
- 24 requirements of this section.
- 25 (f) Pandemic instruction shall:
- 26 <u>(1) Be age appropriate.</u>
- 27 <u>(2) Be sequential in method of study.</u>
- 28 (3) Communicate that the occurrence of a pandemic is a
- 29 <u>concern with widespread consequences without creating an</u>
- 30 atmosphere of fear or despair and with sensitivity to student

- 1 fears and anxieties.
- 2 (4) Communicate the impact of failing to maintain healthy
- 3 <u>well-being throughout a pandemic.</u>
- 4 (g) The State Board of Education shall promulgate or revise
- 5 regulations subject to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633,
- 6 No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to
- 7 <u>implement this section</u>.
- 8 (h) Until the completion of model curriculum under
- 9 <u>subsection (c), a school entity shall, to the extent</u>
- 10 practicable, provide teachers with resources on how they can, in
- 11 meaningful and age-appropriate language, engage in discussions
- 12 with students on the subject of pandemics.
- (i) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 14 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 15 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 16 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 17 Commonwealth.
- 18 "School entity." A school district, charter school, regional
- 19 charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit or area
- 20 career and technical school.
- 21 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
