## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1234, No.204), entitled "An act establishing a program to assist persons who 2 bear primary responsibility for the at-home care of 3 functionally dependent older adults and victims of chronic 4 dementia," further providing for title of act, for intent, 5 for definitions, for primary caregiver support program, for 6 reimbursements, for entitlement not created and for 7 enforcement. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. The title of the act of December 19, 1990 12 (P.L.1234, No.204), known as the Family Caregiver Support Act, 13 is amended to read: 14 AN ACT Establishing a program to assist persons who bear primary 15 16 responsibility for the at-home care of functionally dependent 17 older adults [and victims of chronic dementia.], individuals 18 with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder, children with 19 parents who are unable to care for them and individuals with 20 disabilities. 21 Section 2. Section 2 introductory paragraph of the act is

- 2 Section 2. Intent.
- 3 It is the intent of this act to ease the strain of caregiving
- 4 and to assist adult family members and other individuals who
- 5 bear primary responsibility for the at-home care of functionally
- 6 dependent older adults and other adults who are [victims of
- 7 chronic dementia] living with Alzheimer's disease or a related
- 8 <u>disorder</u> by providing resources for services such as the
- 9 following:

- 11 Section 3. The definitions of "adult with chronic dementia,"
- 12 "care receiver," "household income" and "primary caregiver" in
- 13 section 3 of the act are amended and the section is amended by
- 14 adding definitions to read:
- 15 Section 3. Definitions.
- 16 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 17 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 18 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 19 \* \* \*
- ["Adult with chronic dementia." A person 18 years of age or
- 21 older residing within this Commonwealth who has an irreversible
- 22 global loss of cognitive function, causing evident intellectual
- 23 impairment which always includes memory loss, without alteration
- 24 of state of consciousness as diagnosed by a physician and is
- 25 severe enough to interfere with work or social activities, or
- 26 both, and to require continuous care or supervision.]
- 27 <u>"Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder." An irreversible</u>
- 28 <u>and progressive neurological disorder diagnosed by a physician</u>
- 29 <u>that:</u>
- 30 (1) causes cognitive and memory impairment, behavioral

- and psychiatric problems and the loss of the ability to care
- 2 for oneself;
- 3 (2) is severe enough to interfere with work or social
- 4 activities; and
- 5 (3) requires continuous care or supervision.
- 6 \* \* \*
- 7 "Care receiver." [A functionally dependent older adult or
- 8 other adult with chronic dementia who is being cared for by a
- 9 primary caregiver.] Any of the following:
- 10 (1) A functionally dependent older adult who is 60 years
- of age or older and cared for by a primary caregiver who is
- 12 <u>18 years of age or older.</u>
- 13 (2) An individual with Alzheimer's disease or a related
- disorder who is cared for by a caregiver 18 years of age or
- 15 older.
- 16 (3) A child who is younger than 18 years of age who is
- 17 cared for and resides with an older relative caregiver for a
- 18 child.
- 19 (4) An individual who is between 18 and 59 years of age,
- has a nondementia-related disability and is cared for and
- 21 resides with an older relative caregiver for an individual
- 22 with a disability.

- "Household income." The income of all members of the care
- 25 <u>receiver's</u> household with the exception of a minor or dependent
- 26 student.
- 27 \* \* \*
- 28 "Older relative caregiver for a child." An individual who
- 29 <u>satisfies all of the following criteria:</u>
- 30 (1) The individual is 55 years of age or older and

- 1 resides with a child who is younger than 18 years of age.
- 2 (2) The individual is the grandparent, step-grandparent,
- 3 <u>or other relative, not including the biological or adoptive</u>
- 4 parent related by blood, marriage or adoption.
- 5 (3) The individual is the primary caregiver of the child
- 6 <u>because the biological or adoptive parents are unable or</u>
- 7 <u>unwilling to act as the primary caregiver of the child.</u>
- 8 (4) The individual has a legal relationship to the
- 9 <u>child, including legal custody, adoption or guardianship of</u>
- 10 the child, or is caring for the child in an informal manner.
- 11 <u>"Older relative caregiver for an individual with a</u>
- 12 <u>disability." An individual who satisfies all of the following</u>
- 13 <u>criteria:</u>
- 14 <u>(1) The individual is 55 years of age or older.</u>
- 15 (2) The individual cares for and resides with an
- individual with a disability who is no younger than 18 years
- of age and no older than 59 years of age.
- 18 (3) The individual is the primary caregiver for the
- individual with a disability.
- 20 (4) The individual is the parent, grandparent or other
- 21 relative of the individual with a disability by blood,
- 22 marriage or adoption.
- "Primary caregiver." [The one identified adult family member
- 24 or other individual who has assumed the primary responsibility
- for the provision of care needed to maintain the physical or
- 26 mental health of a care receiver and who does not receive
- 27 financial compensation for the care provided. A substantiated
- 28 case of abuse, neglect, exploitation, abandonment as defined in
- 29 the act of November 6, 1987 (P.L.381, No.79), known as the Older
- 30 Adults Protective Services Act, or pursuant to any other civil

- 1 or criminal statute regarding an older adult, shall prohibit a
- 2 primary caregiver from receiving benefits under this act unless
- 3 authorized by the department to prevent further abuse.] The one
- 4 <u>identified family member or other responsible individual who has</u>
- 5 primary responsibility for the provision of care, including the
- 6 coordination of care and services needed to maintain the
- 7 physical and mental health of the care receiver and who does not
- 8 receive financial compensation for the care provided.
- 9 Section 4. Sections 4(b)(3), 5(b), 6 and 8 of the act are

- 11 Section 4. Primary caregiver support program.

- 13 (b) Authority.--
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 (3) After all eligibility criteria have been met, the
- department shall give priority in awarding assistance paid
- for by the State Lottery Fund to primary caregivers who
- 18 provide care for a functionally dependent older adult [and an
- adult 60 years of age or older with chronic dementia, such
- 20 as] and an older adult with Alzheimer's disease or a related
- 21 disorder.

- 23 Section 5. Reimbursements.

- 25 (b) Maximum amounts.--
- 26 (1) The maximum amount available to a qualified primary
- 27 caregiver whose care receivers' household income is under
- 28 200% of the Federal poverty guidelines shall be established
- by [regulation, but shall not exceed \$200 per month,] the
- department for out-of-pocket expenses incurred for services.

need, the maximum amount available to a qualified primary

caregiver may exceed \$200 but shall not be more than

- (ii) Reimbursement under subparagraph (i) shall be limited to \$200 if an area agency on aging's average monthly reimbursement exceeds \$300 across its entire caregiver support program caseload.]
- (2) The maximum amount available to a qualified primary caregiver whose care receivers' household income is under 200% of the Federal poverty guidelines shall be established by [regulation, but shall not exceed \$2,000] the department for the entire duration of the case, for expenses incurred for home modifications or assistive devices as described under section 4(c)(3).

- 21 (a) Entitlement not created. -- Nothing in this act creates or
- 22 provides any individual with an entitlement to services or
- 23 benefits. Services under this act shall be made available only
- 24 to the extent of the availability and level of appropriations
- 25 made by the General Assembly.
- 26 (b) Prohibition. -- A substantiated case of abuse, neglect,
- 27 <u>exploitation or abandonment under the act of November 6, 1987</u>
- 28 (P.L.381, No.79), known as the Older Adults Protective Services
- 29 Act, the act of October 7, 2010 (P.L.484, No.70), known as the
- 30 Adult Protective Services Act, 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to

- 1 <u>child protective services</u>) or under any other law of this
- 2 <u>Commonwealth regarding an older adult, a child or an individual</u>
- 3 with a disability, shall prohibit a primary caregiver from
- 4 receiving benefits under this act unless authorized by the
- 5 <u>department to prevent further abuse</u>, <u>neglect</u>, <u>exploitation or</u>
- 6 <u>abandonment</u>.
- 7 Section 8. Enforcement.
- 8 The department shall have authority to establish penalties,
- 9 by regulation, associated with the violation of this act or
- 10 departmental rules or regulations promulgated under this act.
- 11 The department may not promulgate a regulation under this
- 12 section that interferes with any privileges or rights provided
- 13 under Federal law.
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
