## AN ACT

1 2	Providing for protection of paychecks of certain workers and for the collection of political contributions.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Short title.
6	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Protection of
7	Public Employee Wages Act.
8	Section 2. Public policy.
9	The General Assembly finds and declares that it is the public
10	policy of this Commonwealth and the purpose of this act to
11	promote orderly and constructive relationships between employers
12	and their employees and that this overall policy may be
13	accomplished, at least in part, by ensuring public employers do
14	not collect money intended for political or other inappropriate
15	purposes from the wages of public employees.
16	Section 3. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
 context clearly indicates otherwise:

3 "Fair share fee." The regular membership dues required of members of an employee organization acting as exclusive 4 representative less the cost for the previous fiscal year of its 5 activities or undertakings which were not reasonably employed to 6 7 implement or effectuate the duties of the employee organization 8 as exclusive representative. This definition shall stand in pari materia with the definition of "fair share fee" in section 2215 9 10 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, and the definition of "fair share 11 12 fee" in section 2 of the act of June 2, 1993 (P.L.45, No.15), known as the Public Employee Fair Share Fee Law. 13

14 "Political contribution." Money or funds appropriated to be 15 used for:

16 (1) a contribution, as defined in section 1621 of the 17 act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the 18 Pennsylvania Election Code;

19 (2) an independent expenditure, as defined in section
20 1621 of the Pennsylvania Election Code;

(3) an expenditure, as defined in section 1621 of the
 Pennsylvania Election Code;

23 (4) lobbying, as defined in 65 Pa.C.S. § 13A03 (relating
24 to definitions);

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(5) a voter registration drive;

26 (6) a get-out-the-vote drive; or

27 (7) any other electoral, political or legislative28 purpose.

29 "Public employee." An individual employed by a public 30 employer, including a public school employee under the act of

March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
 of 1949.

"Public employer." The Commonwealth, a political
subdivision, a school district and any officer, board,
commission, agency, authority or other instrumentality thereof.
"Wages." Hourly rates of pay, salary or other form of
compensation due to an employee for services rendered.
Section 4. Protection of public employee wages.

9 Paycheck protection. -- A public employer may not deduct (a) 10 from the wages of a public employee money or funds to be used 11 for political contributions, except as required by a valid 12 collective bargaining agreement entered into between a public 13 employer and a representative of its employees prior to the 14 effective date of this section. No individual or organization shall seek to have a political contribution deducted from the 15 16 wages of a public employee. A collective bargaining agreement 17 entered into, renewed or extended on or after the effective date 18 of this section shall not contain provisions authorizing or 19 requiring the deduction of political contributions.

(b) Applicability.--Nothing in this section shall beconstrued to preclude a public employer from:

(1) deducting a designated amount for a charitablecontribution expressly authorized by an employee; or

(2) if required to do so by a collective bargaining
agreement entered into with a representative of its
employees, deducting from the wages of an employee
organization member an amount equal to, but not greater than,
a fair share fee.
