## AN ACT

- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 23 (Domestic 1 Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 2 offenses against the family, further providing for newborn 3 protection; in child protective services, further providing for definitions and for taking child into protective custody; 5 and, in newborn protection, further providing for definitions and for incubators for newborns, providing for health care 7 providers at urgent care centers accepting newborns and 8 further providing for reporting acceptance of newborns, for immunity and for duties of department. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- 13 Section 1. Section 4306 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 14 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 15 § 4306. Newborn protection.
- 16 (a) General rule. -- A parent of a newborn shall not be
- 17 criminally liable for any violation of this title solely for
- 18 leaving a newborn in the care of a hospital, an urgent care
- 19 <u>center</u>, a police officer at a police station pursuant to 23
- 20 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to newborn protection) or an emergency
- 21 services provider on the grounds of an entity employing the

- 1 emergency services provider or otherwise providing access to the
- 2 emergency services provider pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 if the
- 3 following criteria are met:
- 4 (1) The parent expresses, either orally or through
- 5 conduct, the intent to have the hospital, <u>urgent care center</u>,
- 6 police officer or emergency services provider accept the
- 7 newborn pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65.
- 8 (2) The newborn is not a victim of child abuse or
- 9 criminal conduct.
- 10 (a.1) Incubator.--A parent of a newborn shall not be
- 11 criminally liable for any violation of this title solely for
- 12 leaving a newborn in an incubator if the newborn is not a victim
- 13 of child abuse or criminal conduct and the incubator is located:
- 14 (1) at a hospital;
- 15 (2) at a police station pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65;
- 16 [or]
- 17 (3) on the grounds of an entity employing the emergency
- services provider or otherwise providing access to the
- emergency services provider pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65[.];
- 20 <u>or</u>
- 21 <u>(4) at an urgent care center.</u>
- 22 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 23 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 24 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Child abuse." As defined in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6303(b.1)
- 26 (relating to definitions).
- 27 "Emergency services provider." An emergency medical
- 28 responder, emergency medical technician, advanced emergency
- 29 medical technician or a paramedic as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. §
- 30 8103 (relating to definitions).

- 1 "Newborn." As defined in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6502 (relating to
- 2 definitions).
- 3 "Police department." A public agency of a political
- 4 subdivision having general police powers and charged with making
- 5 arrests in connection with the enforcement of criminal or
- 6 traffic laws.
- 7 "Police officer." A full-time or part-time employee assigned
- 8 to criminal or traffic law enforcement duties of a police
- 9 department of a county, city, borough, town or township. The
- 10 term also includes a member of the State Police Force.
- 11 "Police station." The station or headquarters of a police
- 12 department or a Pennsylvania State Police station or
- 13 headquarters.
- 14 <u>"Urgent care center."</u> As defined in section 2 of the act of
- 15 November 2, 2016 (P.L.976, No.122), known as the Safe Emergency
- 16 <u>Prescribing Act.</u>
- 17 Section 2. Section 6303(a) of Title 23 is amended by adding
- 18 a definition to read:
- 19 § 6303. Definitions.
- 20 (a) General rule. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 21 in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 22 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 24 "Urgent care center." As defined in section 2 of the act of
- 25 November 2, 2016 (P.L.976, No.122), known as the Safe Emergency
- 26 Prescribing Act.

- 28 Section 3. Section 6315(a) of Title 23 is amended by adding
- 29 a paragraph to read:
- 30 § 6315. Taking child into protective custody.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- A child may be taken into protective
- 2 custody:

- 4 (7) By a health care provider at an urgent care center
- 5 <u>under Chapter 65.</u>
- 6 \* \* \*
- 7 Section 4. The definitions of "department" and "health care
- 8 provider" in section 6502 of Title 23 are amended and the
- 9 section is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 10 § 6502. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 12 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 "Department." The Department of [Public Welfare] Human
- 16 <u>Services</u> of the Commonwealth.
- 17 \* \* \*
- 18 "Health care provider." A person who is licensed or
- 19 certified by the laws of this Commonwealth to administer health
- 20 care in the ordinary course of business or practice of a
- 21 profession. For purposes of accepting a newborn as provided in
- 22 section 6504(a)(1) (relating to accepting newborns) and for
- 23 immunity provided pursuant to section 6507 (relating to
- 24 immunity), the term includes administrative, managerial and
- 25 security personnel and any other person employed by a hospital
- 26 or urgent care center.

- 28 "Urgent care center." As defined in section 2 of the act of
- 29 November 2, 2016 (P.L.976, No.122), known as the Safe Emergency
- 30 Prescribing Act.

- Section 5. Section 6504.3(a) and (b)(4)(i), (v) and (vi) and
- 2 (5) of Title 23 are amended to read:
- 3 \ 6504.3. Incubators for newborns.
- 4 (a) Provision optional. -- A hospital, police station, urgent
- 5 <u>care center</u> or [other] entity employing or otherwise providing
- 6 access to an emergency services provider may provide an
- 7 incubator for the care of a newborn accepted under this chapter.
- 8 (b) Regulations. -- The Department of Health shall promulgate
- 9 regulations for providing an incubator under subsection (a). The
- 10 regulations shall include all of the following:
- 11 \* \* \*
- 12 (4) Design and function requirements for an incubator 13 which shall include all of the following:
- (i) Installation of an incubator at a hospital,

  police station, urgent care center or [other] entity

  which employs or otherwise provides access to an

  emergency services provider.

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- (v) Providing notice to the personnel of a hospital, police station, urgent care center or [other] entity which employs or otherwise provides access to an emergency services provider within 30 seconds of the infant being placed by the parent in the incubator.
  - (vi) Triggering a 911 call if the personnel of a hospital, police station, urgent care center or [other] entity which employs or otherwise provides access to an emergency services provider does not respond within a reasonable amount of time under subparagraph (v).
- 29 (5) Operating policy, supervision and maintenance 30 requirements for an incubator, including that only an

- 2 otherwise provides access to the emergency services provider,
- a health care provider at a hospital  $[or]_L$  police officer at

- 5 <u>center</u> may take an infant into protective custody in

- 9 Section 6. Title 23 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 § 6504.4. Health care providers at urgent care centers
- 11 <u>accepting newborns.</u>
- 12 (a) Duties.--A health care provider at an urgent care center
- 13 shall do all of the following relating to a newborn accepted
- 14 <u>under this chapter:</u>
- 15 (1) Take the newborn into protective custody under
- 16 <u>section 6315(a)(7) (relating to taking child into protective</u>
- 17 custody).
- 18 (2) Ensure that the newborn is transported to a hospital
- 19 and placed into the care of a health care provider under
- 20 <u>section 6504 (relating to health care providers accepting</u>
- 21 <u>newborns</u>).
- 22 (b) Medical history. -- When a health care provider at an
- 23 urgent care center accepts a newborn under this chapter, a
- 24 parent may provide the health care provider with information
- 25 about the newborn's medical history and identifying information.
- 26 (c) Signage. -- An urgent care center accepting newborns under
- 27 this chapter shall ensure that the urgent care center's grounds
- 28 and building display signs that specify the operating hours
- 29 during which the urgent care center accepts newborns under
- 30 section 6315(a)(7) and 18 Pa.C.S. § 4306 (relating to newborn

- 1 protection).
- 2 Section 7. Sections 6505, 6507 and 6509 of Title 23 are
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 § 6505. Reporting acceptance of newborns.
- 5 A health care provider at a hospital shall in all cases
- 6 notify the county agency and the local municipal police
- 7 department or the Pennsylvania State Police where no municipal
- 8 police jurisdiction exists immediately by telephone regarding a
- 9 newborn accepted by a hospital under this chapter. A written
- 10 report shall be submitted to the county agency and local
- 11 municipal police department or the Pennsylvania State Police
- 12 within 48 hours after the oral report. This section applies in
- 13 the case of a hospital accepting a newborn pursuant to sections
- 14 6504.1(a)(2) (relating to police officers accepting newborns)
- 15 [and], 6504.2(a)(2) (relating to emergency services providers
- 16 accepting newborns) and 6504.4(a)(2) (relating to health care
- 17 providers at urgent care centers accepting newborns). [For
- 18 purposes of this section, the term "health care provider" shall
- 19 include administrative, managerial and security personnel

- 22 Except for a violation of section 6506 (relating to failure
- 23 to report acceptance of newborns), no emergency services
- 24 provider, entity that employs or otherwise provides access to an
- 25 emergency services provider, hospital, <u>urgent care center</u>,
- 26 health care provider at a hospital or urgent care center or
- 27 police department, police officer or administrative or
- 28 managerial personnel of a police department shall be subject to
- 29 civil liability or criminal penalty solely by reason of
- 30 complying with the provisions of this chapter.

- 2 The department shall provide educational materials for use by
- 3 emergency services providers, entities which employ or otherwise
- 4 provide access to emergency services providers, hospitals,
- 5 <u>urgent care centers</u>, health care providers, employees at
- 6 hospitals and police officers regarding this chapter, section
- 7 6315(a)(3) (relating to taking child into protective custody)
- 8 and other applicable provisions of Chapter 63 (relating to child
- 9 protective services) that relate to newborn protection. The
- 10 department shall promulgate such regulations as may be necessary
- 11 to implement this chapter, section 6315(a)(3) and other
- 12 applicable provisions of Chapter 63 that relate to newborn
- 13 protection. The department shall also provide emergency services
- 14 providers, entities which employ or otherwise provide access to
- 15 emergency services providers, health care providers, hospitals,
- 16 urgent care centers, the Pennsylvania State Police and police
- 17 departments with an informational pamphlet regarding this
- 18 chapter, section 6315(a)(3) and other applicable provisions of
- 19 Chapter 63 that relate to newborn protection which may be
- 20 distributed to the public. In addition, the department shall
- 21 comply with the provisions regarding infant abandonment in
- 22 sections 6365 (relating to services for prevention,
- 23 investigation and treatment of child abuse) and 6383 (relating
- 24 to education and training). A report shall be made annually to
- 25 the General Assembly on the number and disposition of newborns
- 26 accepted in accordance with this chapter, section 6315(a)(3) and
- 27 (5) and other applicable provisions of Chapter 63 that relate to
- 28 newborn protection.
- 29 Section 8. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
