5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:

- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

10 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>

11 "Extreme risk protection order." An ex parte order or a

12 final order granted under this chapter.

13 "Family or household member." A spouse or person who has

14 been a spouse, person living as a spouse or who lived as a

15 spouse, parent or child, other person related by consanguinity

16 or affinity, current or former sexual or intimate partner or

17 person who shares biological parenthood.

18 "Firearm." The term shall have the same meaning given to it

19 under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6111(f) (relating to sale or transfer of

20 <u>firearms).</u>

21 "Firearm license." A license issued under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6109

22 (relating to licenses).

23 <u>"Foreign extreme risk protection order." An extreme risk</u>

24 protection order issued in the United States or its possessions.

25 "Minor court." A magisterial district judge or a judge of

26 the Philadelphia Municipal Court, commissioner appointed under

27 section 1123 (relating to jurisdiction and venue), master_

28 appointed under section 1126 (relating to masters) or master for

29 <u>emergency relief.</u>

30 "Petitioner." A person who petitions for an order under this

1	<u>chapter.</u>
2	"Respondent." A person who is identified as the respondent
3	in a petition filed under this chapter.
4	<u>§ 62B02. Petition for order.</u>
5	(a) Establishment of action
6	(1) An action known as a petition for an extreme risk
7	protection order is established.
8	(2) A petition for an extreme risk protection order may
9	be filed by:
10	(i) a family or household member of the respondent;
11	or
12	(ii) a law enforcement officer or agency.
13	(3) An action under this chapter must be filed in the
14	county where the petitioner resides or the county where the
15	respondent resides.
16	(b) Contents of petition A petition shall:
17	(1) Allege that the respondent poses a significant
18	danger of causing personal injury to self or others by having
19	in the respondent's custody or control, purchasing,
20	possessing or receiving a firearm and be accompanied by an
21	affidavit made under oath stating the specific statements,
22	actions or facts that give rise to a reasonable belief of
23	future dangerous acts by the respondent.
24	(2) Identify the number, types and locations of the
25	firearms the petitioner reasonably believes to be in the
26	respondent's current ownership, possession, custody or
27	<u>control.</u>
28	(3) Identify whether there is a known existing
29	protection order governing the respondent under any other
30	applicable statute.

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1	(4) Identify whether there is a pending lawsuit,
2	complaint, petition or other action between the parties to
3	the petition under the laws of this Commonwealth.
4	(c) Effect of existing orders and pending actions
5	(1) The prothonotary shall verify the terms of any
6	existing order governing the parties.
7	(2) The court may not delay granting relief because of
8	the existence of a pending action between the parties or the
9	necessity of verifying the terms of an existing order.
10	(3) A petition for an extreme risk protection order may
11	be granted whether or not there is a pending action between
12	the parties.
13	(d) Notice to family and household members
14	(1) If the petitioner is a law enforcement officer or
15	agency, the petitioner shall make a good faith effort to
16	provide notice to a family or household member of the
17	respondent and to any known third party who may be at risk of
18	<u>violence.</u>
19	(2) The notice shall state that the petitioner intends
20	to petition the court for an extreme risk protection order or
21	has already done so and include referrals to appropriate
22	resources, including mental health, domestic violence and
23	counseling resources.
24	(3) The petitioner shall attest in the petition to
25	having provided the notice or attest to the steps that will
26	be taken to provide the notice.
27	(e) Omission of petitioner's address
28	(1) If the petition states that disclosure of the
29	petitioner's address would risk harm to the petitioner or a
30	family or household member of the petitioner, the

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1	petitioner's address may be omitted from all documents filed
2	with the court.
3	(2) If the petitioner has not disclosed an address under
4	this subsection, the petitioner shall designate an
5	alternative address at which the respondent may serve notice
6	of any motions. If the petitioner is a law enforcement
7	officer or agency, the address of record shall be that of the
8	law enforcement agency.
9	(f) Fees and bonds prohibited
10	(1) No fees for filing or service of process may be
11	charged by a court or any public agency to a petitioner
12	seeking relief under this chapter. The petitioner shall be
13	provided the necessary number of certified copies, forms and
14	instructional brochures free of charge.
15	(2) A person may not be required to post a bond to
16	obtain relief in any proceeding under this section.
17	<u>(g)</u> Jurisdiction
18	(1) The courts of common pleas have jurisdiction over
19	proceedings under this chapter and minor courts have limited
20	jurisdiction over issuance and enforcement of ex parte
21	extreme risk protection orders issued under this chapter.
22	(2) If the notice and order are not served on the
23	respondent in time for the full hearing, the issuing court
24	has concurrent jurisdiction with the court to extend the ex
25	parte extreme risk protection order.
26	<u>§ 62B03. Procedure.</u>
27	(a) HearingUpon receipt of the petition, the court shall
28	order a hearing to be held not later than 14 days from the date
29	of the order and shall issue a notice of hearing to the
30	respondent.

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1	(b) Service on respondent
2	(1) The prothonotary shall cause a copy of the notice of
3	hearing and petition to be forwarded on or before the next
4	judicial day to the appropriate law enforcement agency for
5	service upon the respondent.
6	(2) Personal service of the notice of hearing and
7	petition shall be made upon the respondent by a law
8	enforcement officer not less than five business days prior to
9	the hearing.
10	(c) Ex parte ordersThe court may, as provided in section
11	<u>62B04 (relating to ex parte orders), issue an ex parte extreme</u>
12	risk protection order pending the hearing ordered under
13	subsection (a). An ex parte order shall be served concurrently
14	with the notice of hearing and petition.
15	(d) Findings by courtUpon hearing the matter, if the
16	court finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the
17	respondent poses a significant danger of causing injury to self
18	or others by having in the respondent's custody or control,
19	purchasing, possessing or receiving a firearm, the court shall
20	issue an extreme risk protection order that is effective for a
21	period of one year.
22	(e) EvidenceIn determining whether grounds for an extreme
23	risk protection order exist, the court may consider any relevant
24	evidence, including, but not limited to, any of the following:
25	(1) A recent act or threat of violence or injury by the
26	respondent against self or others, whether or not the
27	violence or threat of violence involves a firearm.
28	(2) A pattern of acts or threats of violence or injury
29	by the respondent within the past 12 months, including, but
30	not limited to, acts or threats of violence by the respondent

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1 <u>against self or others.</u>

2	(3) A dangerous mental health issue of the respondent.
3	(4) A violation by the respondent of a protection order
4	issued under Chapter 62A (relating to protection of victims
5	of sexual violence or intimidation) or 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61
6	(relating to protection from abuse).
7	(5) A previous or existing extreme risk protection order
8	issued against the respondent.
9	(6) A violation of a previous or existing extreme risk
10	protection order issued against the respondent.
11	(7) A conviction of the respondent for a crime that
12	<u>involves domestic violence.</u>
13	(8) The respondent's ownership, access to or intent to
14	possess firearms.
15	(9) The unlawful or reckless use, display or brandishing
16	of a firearm by the respondent.
17	(10) The history of use, attempted use or threatened use
18	of physical force by the respondent against another person or
19	the respondent's history of stalking another person.
20	(11) A prior arrest of the respondent for an offense
21	graded as a felony, crime of violence or personal injury
22	<u>crime.</u>
23	(12) Corroborated evidence of the abuse of controlled
24	substances or alcohol by the respondent.
25	(13) Evidence of recent acquisition of a firearm by the
26	respondent.
27	(f) Authority of courtThe court may:
28	(1) Examine under oath the petitioner, the respondent
29	and witnesses or, in lieu of examination, consider a sworn
30	affidavit of the petitioner, the respondent and witnesses.

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1	(2) Review the criminal history records related to the
2	respondent.
3	(3) Review all records relating to the respondent under
4	the act of July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the
5	Mental Health Procedures Act.
6	(4) During the hearing, consider whether a mental health
7	evaluation or chemical dependency evaluation is appropriate,
8	and order the evaluation if appropriate.
9	(g) Contents of orderAn extreme risk protection order
10	shall include the following:
11	(1) A statement of the grounds supporting the issuance
12	<u>of the order.</u>
13	(2) The date and time the order was issued.
14	(3) The date and time the order expires.
15	(4) Whether a mental health evaluation or chemical
16	dependency evaluation of the respondent is required to be
17	<u>completed.</u>
18	(5) The address of the court in which a responsive
19	pleading may be filed.
20	(6) A description of the requirements for relinquishment
21	of firearms under this chapter.
22	(7) The following statement:
23	To the subject of this protection order: This order
24	will last until the date and time noted above. If you
25	have not done so already, you must surrender to the
26	(insert name of local law enforcement agency) all
27	firearms in your custody, control or possession and
28	the firearm license issued to you immediately. You
29	may not have in your custody or control, purchase,
30	possess, receive or attempt to purchase or receive a

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1	firearm while this order is in effect. You have the
2	right to request a hearing to terminate this order
3	every 12-month period that this order is in effect,
4	starting from the date of this order and continuing
5	through any renewal. You may seek the advice of an
6	attorney as to any matter connected with this order.
7	(h) Notice relating to termination hearingWhen the court
8	issues an extreme risk protection order, the court shall inform
9	the respondent that the respondent may request termination of
10	the order in the manner prescribed in this chapter. The court
11	shall provide the respondent with a form to request a
12	termination hearing.
13	(i) Reasons for denial of orderIf the court denies an
14	extreme risk protection order, the court shall state the
15	particular reasons for the court's denial.
16	<u>§ 62B04. Ex parte orders.</u>
17	(a) General ruleUpon the filing of a petition under
18	section 62B02 (relating to petition for order), a petitioner may
19	request that an ex parte extreme risk protection order be issued
20	before a hearing for an extreme risk protection order, without
21	notice to the respondent, by including in the petition detailed
22	allegations based on personal knowledge that the respondent
23	poses an imminent and significant danger of causing injury to
24	self or others by having in the respondent's custody or control,
25	purchasing, possessing or receiving a firearm.
26	(b) Grounds to issueIf a court finds by clear and
27	convincing evidence that there is reasonable cause to believe
28	that the respondent poses an imminent and significant danger of
29	causing injury to self or others by having in the respondent's
30	custody or control, purchasing, possessing or receiving a
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1	firearm, the court shall issue an ex parte extreme risk
2	protection order.
3	<u>(c) Hearings</u>
4	<u>(1) The court shall hold an ex parte extreme risk</u>
5	protection order hearing on the day the petition is filed or
6	on the judicial day immediately following the day the
7	petition is filed.
8	(2) In accordance with this chapter, the court shall
9	schedule a hearing within 14 days of the issuance of an ex
10	parte extreme risk protection order to determine if a one-
11	year extreme risk protection order is issued under this
12	<u>chapter.</u>
13	(d) Contents of orderAn ex parte extreme risk protection
14	order shall include:
15	(1) A statement of the grounds for the order.
16	(2) The date and time the order was issued.
17	(3) The date and time the order expires.
18	(4) The address of the court in which a responsive
19	pleading may be filed.
20	(5) The date and time of the scheduled hearing.
21	(6) A description of the requirements for surrender of
22	firearms under this chapter.
23	(7) The following statement:
24	To the subject of this protection order: This order
25	is valid until the date and time noted above. You are
26	required to surrender all firearms in your custody,
27	control or possession. You may not have in your
28	custody or control or you may not purchase, possess,
29	receive or attempt to purchase or receive a firearm
30	while this order is in effect. You must surrender to

1	the (insert name of local law enforcement agency) all
2	firearms in your custody, control or possession and
3	the firearm license issued to you immediately. A
4	hearing will be held on the date and at the time
5	noted above to determine if an extreme risk
6	protection order should be issued. Failure to appear
7	at that hearing may result in a court making an order
8	against you that is valid for one year. You may seek
9	the advice of an attorney as to any matter connected
10	with this order.
11	<u>(e) Expiration of orderAn ex parte extreme risk</u>
12	protection order under section 62B03 (relating to procedure)
13	shall expire upon the date of the entry of an extreme risk
14	protection order.
15	(f) Service of orderAn ex parte extreme risk protection
16	order shall be served by a law enforcement officer in the same
17	manner as provided for in this chapter for service of the notice
18	of hearing and petition and shall be served concurrently with
19	the notice of hearing and petition.
20	(g) Reasons for denial of orderIf the court denies an ex
21	parte extreme risk protection order, the court shall state the
22	particular reasons for the court's denial.
23	<u>§ 62B05. Service of orders.</u>
24	An extreme risk protection order issued under this chapter
25	shall be served as provided under section 62B04 (relating to ex
26	parte orders) upon the respondent, except as otherwise provided
27	in this chapter, as follows:
28	(1) The law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in the
29	municipality in which the respondent resides shall serve the
30	respondent personally.

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1	(2) If the law enforcement agency cannot complete
2	service on the respondent within 10 days, the law enforcement
3	agency shall notify the petitioner. The petitioner shall
4	provide information sufficient to permit the notification.
5	(3) If an order entered by the court recites that the
6	respondent appeared in person before the court, the necessity
7	for further service shall be waived and proof of service of
8	<u>that order shall not be necessary.</u>
9	(4) Returns of service under this chapter shall be made
10	in accordance with the applicable court rule.
11	<u>§ 62B06. Termination and renewal of orders.</u>
12	(a) Procedure to terminate
13	(1) The respondent may submit a written request for a
14	hearing to terminate an extreme risk protection order issued
15	under this chapter every 12-month period that the order is in
16	effect, starting from the date of the order and continuing
17	through any renewal.
18	(2) Upon receipt of the request for a hearing to
19	terminate an extreme risk protection order, the court shall
20	set a date for a hearing. Notice of the request shall be
21	served on the petitioner in accordance with this chapter. The
22	hearing shall occur no sooner than 14 days and no later than
23	30 days from the date of service of the request upon the
24	petitioner.
25	(3) The respondent shall have the burden of proving by a
26	preponderance of the evidence that the respondent does not
27	pose a significant danger of causing injury to self or others
28	by having in the respondent's custody or control, or by the
29	respondent purchasing, possessing or receiving, a firearm.
30	The court may consider any relevant evidence, including
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1	evidence of the considerations specified in this chapter for
2	the issuance of an order.
3	(4) If the court finds after the hearing that the
4	respondent has met the respondent's burden of proof, the
5	court shall terminate the order.
6	(b) Notice to petitionerThe court shall notify the
7	petitioner of the impending expiration of an extreme risk
8	protection order. Notice shall be received by the petitioner 90
9	days before the date the order expires.
10	(c) Motion to renew
11	(1) A family or household member of a respondent or a
12	law enforcement officer or agency may by motion request a
13	renewal of an extreme risk protection order at any time
14	within 90 days before the expiration of the order.
15	(2) Upon receipt of the motion to renew, the court shall
16	order that a hearing be held not later than 14 days from the
17	date the order issues.
18	(3) The respondent shall be personally served in the
19	same manner prescribed by section 62B05 (relating to service
20	<u>of orders).</u>
21	(4) In determining whether to renew an extreme risk
22	protection order issued under this subsection, the court
23	shall consider all relevant evidence presented by the
24	petitioner and follow the same procedure as provided in this
25	<u>chapter for issuance of an order.</u>
26	(5) (i) If the court finds by a preponderance of the
27	evidence that the requirements for issuance of an extreme
28	risk protection order continue to be met, the court shall
29	renew the order.
30	(ii) If, after notice, the motion for renewal is

1 uncontested and the petitioner seeks no modification of
2 the order, the order may be renewed on the basis of the
3 petitioner's motion or affidavit stating that there has
4 <u>been no material change in relevant circumstances since</u>
5 <u>entry of the order and stating the reason for the</u>
6 <u>requested renewal.</u>
7 (6) The renewal of an extreme risk protection order
8 shall be for one year, subject to termination as provided in
9 <u>subsection (a) or further renewal by order of the court.</u>
10 <u>§ 62B07. Surrender of firearms.</u>
11 <u>(a) Court orderUpon issuance of an extreme risk</u>
12 protection order under this chapter, including an ex parte
13 extreme risk protection order, the court shall order the
14 respondent to surrender to the local law enforcement agency all
15 firearms in the respondent's custody, control or possession and
16 <u>a firearm license issued under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6109 (relating to</u>
17 <u>licenses).</u>
18 (b) Duties of law enforcement officers
19 (1) The law enforcement officer serving an extreme risk
20 protection order under this chapter, including an ex parte
21 <u>extreme risk protection order, shall request that the</u>
22 respondent immediately surrender all firearms in the
23 respondent's custody, control or possession and the firearm
24 <u>license and conduct any search permitted by law for firearms.</u>
25 (2) The law enforcement officer shall take possession of
26 <u>all firearms belonging to the respondent that are</u>
27 <u>surrendered</u> , in plain sight or discovered from a lawful
28 <u>search.</u>
29 (3) If personal service by a law enforcement officer is
30 not possible, or not required because the respondent was
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1	present at the extreme risk protection order hearing, the
2	respondent shall surrender the firearms in a safe manner to
3	the control of the local law enforcement agency within 48
4	hours of being served with the order by alternate service or
5	within 48 hours of the hearing at which the respondent was
6	present and ordered to surrender all firearms and the firearm
7	license.
8	(4) At the time of surrender, the law enforcement
9	officer taking possession of firearms and the firearm license
10	shall issue a receipt identifying all firearms that have been
11	surrendered and provide a copy of the receipt to the
12	respondent. Within 72 hours after service of the order, the
13	law enforcement officer serving the order shall file the
14	original receipt with the court and shall ensure that the
15	appropriate law enforcement agency retains a copy of the
16	<u>receipt.</u>
17	(c) Effect of failure to complete
18	(1) Upon the sworn statement or testimony of the
19	petitioner or of any law enforcement officer alleging that
20	the respondent has failed to comply with the surrender of
21	firearms as required by an order issued under this chapter,
22	the court shall determine whether probable cause exists to
23	believe that the respondent has failed to surrender all
24	firearms in the respondent's possession, custody or control.
25	(2) If probable cause exists, the court shall issue a
26	warrant describing the firearms and authorizing a search of
27	the locations where the firearms are reasonably believed to
28	be and the seizure of firearms discovered from the search.
29	(d) Other persons who are lawful ownersIf a person other
30	than the respondent claims title to a firearm surrendered under
0.04	

1	this section, and the person is determined by the law
2	enforcement agency to be the lawful owner of the firearm, the
3	firearm shall be returned to the person, provided that:
4	(1) The firearm is removed from the respondent's
5	custody, control or possession and the person agrees to store
6	the firearm in a manner such that the respondent does not
7	have access to or control of the firearm.
8	(2) The firearm is not otherwise unlawfully possessed by
9	the person.
10	(3) The person is informed and acknowledges that
11	providing a firearm to the respondent for whom an order is
12	issued under this chapter commits an offense under 18 Pa.C.S.
13	<u>§ 6105 (relating to persons not to possess, use, manufacture,</u>
14	control, sell or transfer firearms) if the person returns the
15	firearm to the possession of the respondent.
16	<u>(e) Firearm surrender hearing</u>
17	(1) Upon the issuance of a one-year extreme risk
18	protection order, the court shall order a new hearing date
19	and require the respondent to appear not later than three
20	business days from the issuance of the order.
21	(2) The court shall require a showing that the person
22	subject to the order has surrendered all firearms in the
23	person's custody, control or possession.
24	(3) The court may dismiss the hearing upon a
25	satisfactory showing that the respondent is in compliance
26	with the order.
27	(f) Duty of Pennsylvania State PoliceThe Pennsylvania
28	State Police shall develop policies and procedures for use by
29	all law enforcement agencies within 180 days of the effective
30	date of this section regarding the acceptance, storage and
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1	return of firearms required to be surrendered under this
2	<u>chapter.</u>
3	<u>§ 62B08. Return and disposal of firearms.</u>
4	(a) General ruleIf an extreme risk protection order is
5	terminated or expires without renewal, a law enforcement agency
6	holding a firearm and firearm license that has been surrendered
7	under this chapter shall return a surrendered firearm and
8	firearm license requested by a respondent only after confirming:
9	(1) Through a background check, that the respondent is
10	currently eligible to own or possess firearms under Federal
11	and State law.
12	(2) With the court that the extreme risk protection
13	order has terminated or has expired without renewal.
14	(b) Notice to family and household membersA law
15	enforcement agency shall, if requested, provide prior notice of
16	the return of a firearm to a respondent to family or household
17	members of the respondent in the manner provided by law.
18	(c) DisposalA firearm that is surrendered by a respondent
19	under this chapter and remains unclaimed by the lawful owner
20	shall be disposed of in accordance with the law enforcement
21	agency's policies and procedures for the disposal of firearms in
22	police custody.
23	<u>§ 62B09. Reporting of orders.</u>
24	(a) Duties of clerk of court and law enforcement agency
25	(1) The clerk of the court shall enter an extreme risk
26	protection order or ex parte extreme risk protection order
27	issued under this chapter into a Statewide judicial
28	information system on the same day the order is issued.
29	(2) The clerk of the court shall forward a copy of an
30	order issued under this chapter the same day the order is
0.0.1	

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1	issued to the appropriate law enforcement agency specified in
2	the order.
3	(3) The clerk of the court shall forward a copy of the
4	order to the Pennsylvania State Police for entry in the
5	<u>Pennsylvania Instant Check System.</u>
6	(4) Upon receipt of the copy of the order, the law
7	enforcement agency shall enter the order into the national
8	instant criminal background check system, any other Federal
9	or State computer-based system used by law enforcement or
10	others to identify prohibited purchasers of firearms and any
11	computer-based criminal intelligence information system
12	available in this Commonwealth used by law enforcement
13	agencies to list outstanding warrants.
14	(5) The order shall remain in each system for the period
15	stated in the order and the law enforcement agency shall only
16	expunge orders from the systems that have expired or
16 17	<u>expunge orders from the systems that have expired or</u> <u>terminated.</u>

7	(f) Enforcement of foreign extreme risk protection orders
