- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, in equipment standards, further providing for
- unlawful activities; and abrogating regulations.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4107(a)(1) and (b) introductory paragraph
- 7 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are
- 8 amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to
- 9 read:
- 10 § 4107. Unlawful activities.
- 11 (a) Violation of vehicle equipment standards.--
- 12 (1) [It] Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful
- for any person to sell, offer for sale, lease, install or
- 14 replace, either separately or as part of the equipment of a
- vehicle, any item of vehicle equipment affecting the
- 16 operation of the vehicle which does not comply with this
- 17 title or regulations promulgated thereunder, or which does
- 18 not comply with an applicable Federal motor vehicle safety

- 1 standard adopted by regulation by the department.
- 2 * * *
- 3 (b) Other violations.--[It] Except as otherwise provided, it
- 4 is unlawful for any person to do any of the following:
- 5 * * *
- 6 (b.2) Vehicle doors.--If a vehicle is equipped from the
- 7 <u>original manufacturer with manufacturer designed and installed</u>
- 8 removable doors, that vehicle may be operated on the roadways of
- 9 this Commonwealth with the doors removed. This subsection shall
- 10 not limit or otherwise impact section 4534 (relating to rearview
- 11 mirrors) or 4581 (relating to restraint systems).

- 13 Section 2. Any regulations or parts of regulations that are
- 14 inconsistent with this act are abrogated to the extent of the
- 15 inconsistency.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
