AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program;
- 2 prescribing powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Higher
- 3 Education Assistance Agency; providing for scholarships for
- tuition and fees, scholarships for room and board and aid for
- adult reeducation; and establishing the Pennsylvania Promise
- 6 Pilot Program Fund.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Short title.
- 10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 11 Promise Pilot Program Act.
- 12 Section 2. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 15 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 16 "Academic year." A 12-month period commencing on or after
- 17 August 1 of the calendar year.
- 18 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 19 Agency.
- 20 "Community college." An institution created under Article

- 1 XIX-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the
- 2 Public School Code of 1949, or the act of August 24, 1963
- 3 (P.L.1132, No.484), known as the Community College Act of 1963.
- 4 "Eligible adult learner." An individual who:
- 5 (1) Is a resident of this Commonwealth at the time of
- 6 application to the agency for aid to assist with reeducation
- 7 programs under section 8.
- 8 (2) Has been a domiciled resident of this Commonwealth
- 9 as determined by the agency.
- 10 (3) Is 24 years of age or older at the time of
- application to the agency for aid to assist with reeducation
- programs under section 8.
- 13 (4) Has graduated from high school or an equivalent
- 14 approved by the Department of Education.
- 15 (5) Has applied for and been accepted to an institution
- of higher education.
- 17 (6) Has completed a Free Application for Federal Student
- 18 Aid (FAFSA).
- 19 (7) Has applied for all available Federal Pell grants,
- 20 State grants and institution grants.
- 21 "Eligible student." An individual who:
- 22 (1) Is a resident of this Commonwealth at the time of
- 23 application to the agency for a scholarship under section 6
- 24 or 7.
- 25 (2) Has been a domiciled resident of this Commonwealth
- as determined by the agency.
- 27 (3) Is less than 24 years of age or is an active member
- of a branch of the armed services at the time of application
- 29 to the agency for a scholarship under section 6 or 7.
- 30 (4) Has graduated from high school or an equivalent

- approved by the Department of Education within the previous
- 2 five years.
- 3 (5) Has applied for and been accepted to an institution
- 4 of higher education.
- 5 (6) Has completed a Free Application for Federal Student
- 6 Aid (FAFSA).
- 7 (7) Has applied for all available Federal Pell grants,
- 8 State grants and institution grants.
- 9 "Fees." Fixed charges to recover costs of certain services,
- 10 materials or activities provided. Fees may not exceed the
- 11 highest fixed charges set by the Board of Governors of the State
- 12 System of Higher Education.
- 13 "Full-time student." An individual enrolled in an
- 14 undergraduate degree program at an institution of higher
- 15 education and registered for a minimum of 12 credits per
- 16 semester or equivalent enrollment as set by the agency.
- 17 "Fund." The Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program Fund
- 18 established under section 5.
- "Institution of higher education." Any of the following:
- 20 (1) A community college.
- 21 (2) A State-owned institution.
- 22 (3) A State-related institution.
- 23 (4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
- "Part-time student." An individual enrolled in an
- 25 institution of higher education and registered for less than 12
- 26 credits per semester or equivalent enrollment as set by the
- 27 agency.
- 28 "Program." The Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program
- 29 established under this act.
- "Room and board." The standard educational expense allowance

- 1 for the most recent year as determined by the agency.
- 2 "Scholarship for room and board." A scholarship for room and
- 3 board awarded by the agency under section 7.
- 4 "Scholarship for tuition and fees." A scholarship for
- 5 tuition and fees awarded under section 6.
- 6 "State-owned institution." An institution which is part of
- 7 the State System of Higher Education under Article XX-A of the
- 8 Public School Code of 1949 and all branches and campuses of the
- 9 institution.
- 10 "State-related institution." The Pennsylvania State
- 11 University, Pennsylvania College of Technology, University of
- 12 Pittsburgh, Temple University, Lincoln University and associated
- 13 branch campuses of the universities.
- "Tuition." An amount not to exceed the maximum undergraduate
- 15 in-State tuition rate established by the Board of Governors of
- 16 the State System of Higher Education for rendering educational
- 17 services, as enumerated in Article XX-A of the Public School
- 18 Code of 1949. The agency, at its discretion, may increase the
- 19 maximum amount.
- 20 Section 3. Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program.
- 21 The Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program is established within
- 22 the agency.
- 23 Section 4. Procedure.
- 24 (a) Agency. -- The agency shall administer the program and
- 25 carry out this act.
- 26 (b) Regulations. -- The agency may adopt rules and regulations
- 27 necessary to administer this act.
- 28 Section 5. Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program Fund.
- 29 (a) Fund. -- The Pennsylvania Promise Pilot Program Fund is
- 30 established in the State Treasury.

- 1 (b) Administration of fund. -- Money in the fund is
- 2 appropriated to the agency on an ongoing basis to carry out this
- 3 act.
- 4 (c) Contributions and investment.--
- 5 (1) The fund may accept gifts, donations, legacies or
- 6 any other revenues.
- 7 (2) Interest earned by the fund shall remain in the
- 8 fund.
- 9 (d) Purpose. -- Money in the fund shall be used for the
- 10 purpose stated in this act.
- 11 (e) Nonlapsing. -- Money in the fund shall not lapse and shall
- 12 be available in subsequent fiscal years to be used in accordance
- 13 with the provisions of this act.
- 14 (f) Allocation. -- For fiscal year 2024-2025, the agency shall
- 15 allocate:
- 16 (1) No more than \$10,000,000 from the fund for eligible
- 17 adult learners.
- 18 (2) No more than \$125,000,000 from the fund to eligible
- 19 students attending a State-owned institution in accordance
- with sections 6 and 7.
- 21 (3) No more than \$50,000,000 from the fund to eliqible
- 22 students attending a State-related institution in accordance
- with sections 6 and 7.
- 24 (4) No more than \$35,000,000 from the fund to eligible
- students attending a community college.
- 26 (g) Reallocation. -- Notwithstanding subsection (f), the
- 27 agency may allocate money from the fund to eligible students
- 28 attending an institution of higher education in accordance with
- 29 sections 6 and 7.
- 30 (h) Administrative costs.--For fiscal year 2024-2025, the

- 1 agency may utilize no more than \$5,000,000 from the fund to
- 2 cover the agency's costs associated with administering and
- 3 operating the program.
- 4 (i) Interfund transfer. -- No later than July 1, 2024, the sum
- 5 of \$225,000,000 shall be transferred from the General Fund to
- 6 the fund.
- 7 Section 6. Scholarship for tuition and fees.
- 8 (a) Application. -- The agency shall accept applications, in a
- 9 form and manner as determined by the agency, from eligible
- 10 students for a scholarship for tuition and fees as provided in
- 11 this section.
- 12 (b) Scholarship at State-owned or State-related
- 13 institution. -- An eligible student may receive a scholarship for
- 14 tuition and fees at a State-owned institution or State-related
- 15 institution for the academic year in an amount not to exceed the
- 16 outstanding tuition and fees after Federal, State and
- 17 institution grants have been applied, if the eligible student:
- 18 (1) has a total annual household income that does not
- 19 exceed \$200,000; and
- 20 (2) is enrolled full time.
- 21 (c) Scholarship at community college. -- An eligible student
- 22 may receive a scholarship at a community college for the
- 23 academic year in an amount not to exceed the outstanding tuition
- 24 and fees after Federal, State and institution grants have been
- 25 applied if, at a minimum, the eligible student is enrolled full
- 26 time.
- 27 (d) Review and approval.--
- 28 (1) The agency shall review all applications submitted
- 29 under this section.
- 30 (2) The agency may approve an application if the

- 1 application meets the requirements under subsection (b) or
- 2 (c) and if the eligible student submitting the application
- 3 meets the requirements of this act.
- 4 (e) Distribution of scholarship. -- Once an eligible student
- 5 has been approved for a scholarship for tuition and fees, the
- 6 agency shall, upon receipt of an outstanding balance from an
- 7 institution of higher education, pay the outstanding tuition and
- 8 fee balance owed by the eligible student directly to the
- 9 institution of higher education.
- 10 (f) Limitation on scholarship. -- Notwithstanding any
- 11 provision of this act to the contrary, the agency may not issue
- 12 a scholarship in excess of the outstanding balance for tuition
- 13 and fees received from an institution of higher education.
- 14 (q) Renewal.--
- 15 (1) The scholarship for tuition and fees may not exceed
- one academic year.
- 17 (2) The agency shall create an application to allow
- 18 previously approved eligible students to recertify their
- 19 eligibility.
- 20 (3) An eligible student at a State-owned institution or
- 21 State-related institution who has not exceeded the limitation
- in subsection (i) may reapply for the scholarship for tuition
- and fees if the eligible student:
- 24 (i) Is enrolled full time.
- 25 (ii) Is making satisfactory academic progress as
- determined by the institution of higher education, unless
- the eligible student is in the first year of college.
- 28 (iii) While attending a State-owned institution or
- 29 State-related institution, has a total annual household
- income that does not exceed \$200,000.

- 1 (4) An eligible student at a community college who has
- 2 not exceeded the limitation in subsection (i) may reapply for
- 3 the scholarship for tuition and fees if the eligible student:
- 4 (i) Is enrolled full time or part time.
- 5 (ii) Is making satisfactory academic progress,
- 6 unless the eligible student is in the first year of
- 7 college.
- 8 (h) Continued eligibility. -- An eligible student shall be
- 9 continuously enrolled in the institution of higher education for
- 10 the academic year which the eligible student received a
- 11 scholarship for tuition and fees. If the eligible student is not
- 12 continuously enrolled in the institution of higher education,
- 13 the agency, in its discretion, may deny renewal under subsection
- 14 (g).
- 15 (i) Limitation to scholarship.--
- 16 (1) An eligible student may not receive a scholarship
- for tuition and fees if the eligible student:
- 18 (i) While attending a community college, has
- 19 completed no more than four academic years or has earned
- an associate's degree, except as provided in paragraph
- 21 (2).
- 22 (ii) While attending a State-owned institution or
- 23 State-related institution, has completed four academic
- years or has earned a bachelor's degree.
- 25 (2) A student who is otherwise eliqible for a
- 26 scholarship for tuition and fees under this section may not
- 27 receive the scholarship if the local sponsor has not made the
- payment required under section 1913-A(a)(2) of the act of
- March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School
- 30 Code of 1949.

- 1 (3) An eligible student may receive a scholarship for no
- 2 more than four academic years at an institution of higher
- 3 education.
- 4 Section 7. Scholarship for room and board.
- 5 (a) Application. -- The agency shall accept applications, in a
- 6 form and manner as determined by the agency, from eligible
- 7 students for a scholarship for room and board as provided in
- 8 this section.
- 9 (b) Scholarship at State-owned institution or State-related
- 10 institution. -- An eligible student at a State-owned institution
- 11 or State-related institution may receive a scholarship for room
- 12 and board for the academic year after Federal, State and
- 13 institution grants have been applied if the eligible student:
- 14 (1) has a total annual household income that does not
- 15 exceed \$60,000; and
- 16 (2) is enrolled full time.
- 17 (c) Scholarship at community college. -- An eligible student
- 18 at a community college may receive a scholarship for room and
- 19 board for the academic year after Federal, State and institution
- 20 grants have been applied, if the eligible student:
- 21 (1) has a total annual household income that does not
- 22 exceed \$60,000; and
- 23 (2) is enrolled full time or part time.
- 24 (d) Review and approval.--
- 25 (1) The agency shall review all applications submitted
- 26 under this section.
- 27 (2) The agency may approve an application if the
- application meets the requirements under subsection (b) or
- 29 (c) and if the eligible student meets the requirements of
- 30 this act.

- 1 (e) Distribution of scholarship at State-owned institution
- 2 or State-related institution. -- If an eligible student has been
- 3 approved for a scholarship for room and board, the agency shall,
- 4 upon receipt of an outstanding balance from the State-owned
- 5 institution or State-related institution, pay the outstanding
- 6 balance for room and board owed by the eligible student directly
- 7 to the institution.
- 8 (f) Distribution of scholarship at community colleges.--If
- 9 an eligible student has been approved for a scholarship for room
- 10 and board, the agency shall pay a scholarship for room and board
- 11 in a manner decided by the agency.
- 12 (g) Limitation on scholarship.--
- 13 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) and
- 14 notwithstanding any provision of this act to the contrary,
- the agency may not issue a scholarship for room and board in
- 16 excess of the outstanding balance received from a State-owned
- institution or State-related institution.
- 18 (2) The agency may issue a scholarship for room and
- 19 board in excess of the outstanding balance received from a
- 20 community college.
- 21 (3) A student who is otherwise eliqible for a
- scholarship for room and board under this section may not
- 23 receive the scholarship if the local sponsor as defined under
- 24 section 1901-A(2) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, has not made
- the payment required under section 1913-A(a)(2) of the Public
- 27 School Code of 1949.
- 28 (h) Renewal.--
- 29 (1) A scholarship for room and board may not exceed one
- 30 academic year.

- 1 (2) The agency shall create an application to allow 2 previously approved eligible students to recertify the 3 eligible student's eligibility.
 - (3) An eligible student who has not exceeded the limitation in subsection (j) may reapply for the scholarship for room and board if the student is enrolled full time at a State-owned institution or State-related institution or is enrolled full time or part time at a community college and:
- 9 (i) is making satisfactory academic progress, unless 10 the eligible student is in the first year of college; and
- 11 (ii) has a total annual household income that does 12 not exceed \$60,000.
- (i) Continued eligibility.—An eligible student shall be

 continuously enrolled in the institution of higher education for

 the academic year for which the eligible student received a

 scholarship for room and board. If an eligible student is not

 continuously enrolled in the institution of higher education,

 the agency, in its discretion, may deny renewal under subsection

 (h).
- 20 (j) Limitation to eligibility.--
- 21 (1) An eligible student may not receive a scholarship 22 for room and board if the eligible student:
- (i) Except as provided in paragraph (2), has

 completed four academic years or has earned an

 associate's degree while attending a community college.
- 26 (ii) Has completed four academic years or has earned
 27 a bachelor's degree while attending a State-owned
 28 institution or State-related institution.
- 29 (2) An eligible student may receive a scholarship for 30 two academic years at a State-owned institution or State-

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- 1 related institution if eligibility under paragraph (1)(i) has
- 2 been exhausted.
- 3 Section 8. Aid for adult reeducation.
- 4 (a) Application. -- The agency shall accept applications, in a
- 5 form and manner as determined by the agency, from an eligible
- 6 adult learner for aid for adult reeducation.
- 7 (b) Eligibility. -- An eligible adult learner may receive
- 8 assistance for aid for adult reeducation programs for the
- 9 academic year the eligible adult learner:
- 10 (1) has a total annual household income that does not
- 11 exceed \$200,000; and
- 12 (2) has applied for and been accepted into an adult
- 13 reeducation program or adult reeducation certificate program,
- or is enrolled full time or part time in an institution of
- 15 higher education.
- 16 (c) Pennsylvania Targeted Industry Cluster Certificate
- 17 Scholarship Program. -- Notwithstanding any provisions of law, the
- 18 agency may use money allocated for adult reeducation for the
- 19 Pennsylvania Targeted Industry Cluster Certificate Scholarship
- 20 Program.
- 21 (d) Review and approval. --
- 22 (1) The agency shall review all applications submitted
- 23 under this section.
- 24 (2) The agency may approve an application if the
- application meets the requirements under subsection (b) and
- if the eligible adult learner meets the requirements of this
- 27 section.
- 28 (e) Priority. -- When reviewing an application for aid under
- 29 this section, the agency shall prioritize aid for programs that
- 30 lead to an industry-recognized credential that is articulated

- 1 with college credit. The agency shall annually determine and
- 2 post on its publicly accessible Internet website industry-
- 3 recognized credentialed programs which qualify for aid priority
- 4 under this section.
- 5 (f) Distribution of aid.--If an eligible adult learner has
- 6 been approved for aid under this section, the agency shall, upon
- 7 receipt of an outstanding balance from an institution of higher
- 8 education, pay the outstanding balance owed by an adult learner
- 9 directly to the institution of higher education.
- 10 (g) Limitation on aid. -- Notwithstanding any provision of
- 11 this act, the agency may not issue any aid in excess of the
- 12 outstanding balance received from an institution of higher
- 13 education.
- 14 (h) Renewal.--
- 15 (1) Aid awarded to an eligible adult learner shall not
- 16 exceed one academic year.
- 17 (2) The agency shall create an application to allow
- 18 previously approved eligible adult learners to recertify
- 19 their eligibility.
- 20 (3) An eligible adult learner who has not exceeded the
- 21 limitation in subsection (i) may reapply for aid if:
- 22 (i) Enrolled as a full-time or part-time student at
- 23 an institution of higher education or a certificate
- 24 program approved by the agency.
- 25 (ii) Total annual household income does not exceed
- \$200,000.
- 27 (i) Limitation to eligibility. -- An eligible adult learner
- 28 may not receive aid if the eligible adult learner:
- 29 (1) Has:
- 30 (i) completed no more than four academic years while

- 1 attending a community college;
- 2 (ii) earned an associate's degree while attending a
- 3 community college; or
- 4 (iii) completed an industry-recognized credential
- 5 for which the eligible adult learner was enrolled in
- 6 order to qualify for aid.
- 7 (2) Has completed:
- 8 (i) four academic years or has earned a bachelor's
- 9 degree while attending a State-owned institution or
- 10 State-related institution; or
- 11 (ii) industry-recognized credential for which the
- 12 eligible adult learner was enrolled in order to qualify
- for aid.
- 14 Section 9. Annual report.
- Beginning one year after the first scholarship is awarded
- 16 under this act, the agency shall provide the Governor and the
- 17 chairperson and minority chairperson of the Appropriations
- 18 Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and minority
- 19 chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the House of
- 20 Representatives, the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 21 Education Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and
- 22 minority chairperson of the Education Committee of the House of
- 23 Representatives with a report which includes the following:
- 24 (1) The total number of students served by the program.
- 25 (2) A breakdown by race, gender, ethnicity and
- socioeconomic demographic for all students served by the
- 27 program, if known.
- 28 (3) The total number of scholarships awarded and the
- 29 average amount awarded.
- 30 (4) A year-over-year comparison of the net total costs

- 1 at all institutions of higher education in this Commonwealth
- which shall be used to evaluate the adequacy and success of
- 3 the program in lowering college costs.
- 4 (5) Recommendations, if any, for improving access and affordability of higher education.
- 6 (6) A breakdown of the institutions attended by eligible 7 students in the program.
- 8 (7) A breakdown of the majors in which the eligible 9 students in the program are enrolled.
- 10 (8) Any other information.
- 11 Section 10. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect immediately.
