AN ACT

Amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), entitled "An act providing for prescription drug monitoring; 2 creating the ABC-MAP Board; establishing the Achieving Better 3 Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program; and providing 4 for unlawful acts and penalties," further providing for 5 access to prescription information. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 9(b)(7) of the act of October 27, 2014 10 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, is amended 11 12 and the subsection is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 13 Section 9. Access to prescription information. * * * 14 15 (b) Authorized users. -- The following individuals may query 16 the system according to procedures determined by the board and with the following limitations: 17 * * * 18 19 Designated Commonwealth personnel and contracted 20 staff who are responsible for the development and evaluation

1 of quality improvement strategies, program integrity 2 initiatives or conducting internal compliance reviews and 3 data reporting for the medical assistance program, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Pharmaceutical Assistance 4 5 Contract for the Elderly (PACE) or Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly Needs Enhancement Tier (PACENET). 6 7 (12) Personnel of an organization that has an agreement 8 9 to be paid on a capitated basis to provide services to medical assistance beneficiaries, who are engaged in care 10 management, the development and evaluation of quality 11 12 improvement strategies, program integrity initiatives or 13 conducting internal compliance reviews and data reporting for 14 the medical assistance program. Personnel engaged in these activities: 15 16 (i) May query the system to review the requested 17 dispensing or prescribing of a controlled substance under 18 this act to an individual to whom the organization 19 provides services under Title XIX of the Social Security 20 Act (P.L.74-271, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et seg.). 21 (ii) Shall notify the Department of Human Services 22 and the Office of Attorney General if fraud is suspected 23 based on the results of the query and review of the

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database.

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26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
