## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), entitled "An act providing for prescription drug monitoring; 2 creating the ABC-MAP Board; establishing the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program; and providing for unlawful acts and penalties," further providing for access to prescription information. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 9(b)(7) of the act of October 27, 2014 10 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by 11 Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC MAP) Act, is amended 12 and the subsection is amended by adding paragraphs to read: 13 SECTION 1. SECTION 9(B)(7) OF THE ACT OF OCTOBER 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, NO.191), KNOWN AS THE ACHIEVING BETTER CARE BY 14 15 MONITORING ALL PRESCRIPTIONS PROGRAM (ABC-MAP) ACT, IS AMENDED, 16 THE SUBSECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING PARAGRAPHS AND THE SECTION 17 IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ: 18 Section 9. Access to prescription information.

1 (b) Authorized users.--The following individuals may query 2 the system according to procedures determined by the board and 3 with the following limitations:

staff who are responsible for the development and evaluation of quality improvement strategies, program integrity initiatives or conducting internal compliance reviews and data reporting for the medical assistance program, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly (PACE) or Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract for the Elderly Needs Enhancement Tier (PACENET).

- OR THEIR DESIGNEES, of an organization that has an agreement to be paid on a capitated basis to provide services to medical assistance beneficiaries, who are engaged in care management, the development and evaluation of quality improvement strategies, program integrity initiatives or conducting internal compliance reviews and data reporting for the medical assistance program. Personnel engaged in these activities:
  - (i) May query the system to review the requested

    dispensing or prescribing of a controlled substance under

    this act to an individual to whom the organization

    provides services under Title XIX of the Social Security

  - (ii) Shall notify the Department of Human Services

9	of connecting them with addiction treatment professionals
10	and programs, including single county authorities.

15	(14) Political subdivisions of the Commonwealth may not

20	(13) (I) AN AUTHORIZED EMPLOYEE OF A COUNTY OR <
21	MUNICIPAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
22	OF THE COMMONWEALTH MAY HAVE ACCESS TO DATA FROM THE
23	SYSTEM FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

- 8 OF PRESCRIPTION DATA BY PRESCRIBERS AND DISPENSERS IN ADDITION
- 9 TO THE DATABASE ESTABLISHED UNDER SECTION 6.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. AS <--
- 11 FOLLOWS:
- 12 (1) THIS SECTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
- 13 (2) THE ADDITION OF SECTION 9(D) OF THE ACT SHALL TAKE
- 14 EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
- 15 (3) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60
- DAYS.
