6	Section 1. Section 5514 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 5514. Pool selling and bookmaking.
9	[A] (a) Offense definedExcept as provided in subsection
10	<u>(b), a</u> person is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree if
11	he:
12	(1) engages in pool selling or bookmaking;
13	(2) occupies any place for the purpose of receiving,
14	recording or registering bets or wagers, or of selling pools;
15	(3) receives, records, registers, forwards, or purports
16	or pretends to forward, to another, any bet or wager upon the
17	result of any political nomination, appointment or election,
18	or upon any contest of any nature;

1	(4) becomes the custodian or depository, for gain or
2	ward, of any property staked, wagered or pledged, or to be
3	staked, wagered, or pledged upon any such result; or
4	(5) being the owner, lessee, or occupant of any
5	premises, knowingly permits or suffers the same, to be used
6	or occupied for any of such purposes.
7	(b) Authorized poolsAny person who conducts or
8	participates in a pool is not subject to prosecution under
9	subsection (a) if all of the following apply:
10	(1) Not more than 100 individuals participate in the
11	pool.
12	(2) The maximum amount wagered for each individual entry
13	<u>in the pool is \$20.</u>
14	(3) Other than the wager no other money or thing of
15	value is paid or given for participation in the pool.
16	(4) All wagers collected for entry into the pool are
17	paid as prizes to one or more participants in the pool or to
18	a clearly identified nonprofit organization.
19	(5) No wagers or portions thereof are retained by the
20	person or entity operating the pool and collecting wagers for
21	participation.
22	(6) The transaction of entering the pool is incidental
