22	Section 1. Title 30 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

25	<u>(a) Authority</u>
26	(1) Beginning July 1, 2019, the commission, in

1	accordance with paragraph (2), may change or set the fees
2	provided under any of the following:
3	(i) Section 502 (relating to service charge for
4	uncollectible checks).
5	(ii) Section 2715(a)(1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6),
6	(6.1), (6.2) and (7), (a.1)(1), (4) and (5) and (b)
7	(relating license, permit and issuing agent fees).
8	(iii) Section 2902 (relating to net permits).
9	(iv) Section 2903 (relating to boat and net licenses
10	for boundary lakes).
11	(v) Section 2906 (relating to permits for use of
12	<u>explosives).</u>
13	(vi) Section 3102 (relating to fees).
14	(vii) Section 3509 (relating to obstructing
15	migration of fish).
16	(viii) Section 5104 (relating to fees).
17	(ix) Section 5304 (relating to issuing agents).
18	(x) Section 5327 (relating to fees).

21	(2) A change or setting of a fee under this subsection
22	shall be done as follows:
23	(i) The commission shall publish a notice of
24	proposed rulemaking containing the proposed fee change in
25	accordance with section 201 of the act of July 31, 1968
26	(P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth
27	Documents Law. The commission shall give at least 30 days
28	for the submission of written comments and shall hold at
29	least one public hearing on the proposed change.
30	(ii) Prior to adoption of a final-form regulation

1	containing a fee change, the commission shall review and
2	consider public comments and may modify the text of the
3	final-form regulation as the commission deems necessary
4	under section 202 of the Commonwealth Documents Law.
5	
	(iii) After adoption of a final-form regulation
6	containing a fee change, the commission shall submit the
7	final-form regulation, copies of all public comments and
8	the transcript of the public hearing to the Game and
9	Fisheries Committee of the Senate and the Game and
10	Fisheries Committee of the House of Representatives.
11	(iv) Either committee under subparagraph (iii) may
12	report a concurrent resolution recommending disapproval
13	of the fee change within 30 days of the submission under
14	subparagraph (iii) or within 10 legislative session days,
15	whichever is later. If neither committee reports a
16	concurrent resolution recommending disapproval within the
17	time prescribed in this subparagraph, the fee change
18	shall be deemed approved.
19	(v) If either committee reports a concurrent
20	resolution under subparagraph (iv) and the General
21	Assembly does not adopt the concurrent resolution within
22	30 days of the date that the concurrent resolution is
23	reported or within 10 legislative days, whichever is
24	later, the fee change shall be deemed approved.
25	(vi) If the General Assembly adopts a concurrent
26	resolution under subparagraph (iv) within 30 days of the
27	date that the concurrent resolution is reported or within
28	10 legislative session days, whichever is later, the
29	following shall apply:
30	(A) The concurrent resolution shall be presented

1	to the Governor in accordance with section 9 of
2	Article III of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
3	(B) If the Governor does not veto the concurrent
4	resolution of the General Assembly within 10 days
5	after the resolution is presented, the fee change
6	shall be deemed disapproved.
7	(C) If the Governor vetoes the concurrent
8	resolution within 10 days after the resolution is
9	presented, the General Assembly may override the veto
10	<u>by a two-thirds vote in each house within 30 days</u>
11	after the veto or within 10 legislative session days,
12	whichever is later. If the General Assembly does not
13	override the veto in the time prescribed in this
14	clause, the fee change shall be deemed approved. If
15	the General Assembly overrides the veto in the time
16	prescribed in this clause, the fee change shall be
17	deemed disapproved.
18	(vii) If the fee change is deemed approved under
19	subparagraph (iv), (v) or (vi)(C), the commission shall:
20	(A) submit the final-form regulation containing
21	the fee change to the Office of Attorney General for
22	approval as to the legality; and
23	(B) publish an order adopting the final-form
24	regulation containing the fee change and deposit a
25	copy of the final-form regulation with the
26	Legislative Reference Bureau in accordance with
27	section 207 of the Commonwealth Documents Law.
28	(b) ExpirationSubsection (a) shall expire July 15, 2022.
29	Upon expiration, final-form regulations promulgated under
30	<u>subparagraph (vii)(B) shall remain in effect.</u>

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1 (c) Notice. -- The commission shall provide notice of any change of a fee and shall transmit notice of the change of the 2 3 fee to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and post it on the commission's publicly 4 accessible Internet website. 5 Section 2. 14 charged [a fee of] \$15, [to] or a service charge as otherwise

One-Day Tourist Fishing Licenses shall not be issued for fishing during 27 28 the period from March 15 to April 30 of any year. Holders of 29 One-Day Tourist Fishing Licenses shall not be required to obtain special permits, including [trout/salmon permits to fish for 30

7 The commission may issue permits to use or possess nets 8 larger than four feet square or four feet in diameter, or any 9 other seine, trawl or gill net in or along waters of this 10 Commonwealth. The permits when issued shall specify when and where the nets shall be used and for what purposes by the owner 11 or the persons in possession thereof at a fee of \$10[.] or as 12 otherwise established by the commission in accordance with 13

14 section 322.1 (relating to power to set fees).

29 (h) Gill nets.--The use of gill nets for fishing on

boundary lakes shall be prohibited.] 30

(b) Limit on fees.--The fee per permit for taking, catching, 6 killing, possession, introduction, removal, importing, exporting 7 or disturbing of trout [and salmon] is established in section 8 2715 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees). 9 (c) Limit on permits. -- The commission shall not issue 10 permits under the authority of this section for the taking, 11 12 catching, killing, possession, introduction, removal, importing, 13 exporting or disturbing of any game fish other than trout [or 14 salmon]. This subsection shall not affect the issuance of 15 permits for tagged fish contests in boundary lakes. § 2906. Permits for use of explosives. 16

17 The executive director, with the approval of the commission, 18 may grant permits for the use of explosives in waters for 19 engineering purposes upon the payment of a fee of \$50[.] or as 20 otherwise established by the commission in accordance with section 322.1 (relating to power to set fees). The executive 21 director may waive the payment of the fee for Commonwealth 22 23 agencies and political subdivisions. Any person using explosives 24 under a permit shall make restitution to the commission for all 25 fish destroyed. A person who engages in an activity for which a permit is required under this section without first acquiring 26 27 the permit commits a misdemeanor of the third degree. A person using explosives under a permit issued under this section who 28 29 violates any of the terms and conditions of the permit commits a summary offense of the first degree. 30

(a) Permit required.--No person shall fish in Lake Erie,
Presque Isle Bay and their tributaries, including waters that
flow into those tributaries, without first procuring an annual
special permit [for such fishing] to fish in Lake Erie and
tributaries or [the combination trout/salmon/Lake Erie permit] a
combination trout permit and Lake Erie permit.

guide permits may be designated as special issuing agents for

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Tourist Fishing Licenses, Seven-Day Tourist Fishing Licenses
 [and trout/salmon], trout permits [and], special permits [for
 fishing] to fish in Lake Erie and tributaries and combination
 trout permits and Lake Erie permits for the fees specified in
 section 2715.

8 Upon application accompanied by a license fee <u>as</u> prescribed 9 in this chapter, the commission shall issue an annual regulated 10 fishing lake license to an applicant whose application meets the eligibility criteria specified in commission regulations. The 11 12 license shall be effective until December 31 of the year in 13 which it is issued. Each application for a license or a renewal 14 thereof shall be signed by the owner or operator of the 15 regulated fishing lake and shall state the approximate total 16 area of fishing water on the premises to be licensed and whether 17 the area consists of one body of water or more than one, 18 together with any other information relative thereto as the 19 commission may prescribe. Any time 30 days after the terminal date, if a marine business chooses to have all rights, title and interest in a boat or any related equipment transferred to the marine business by operation of law, the marine business shall on the same day send the following two written notices by certified mail, return receipt requested:

22 To an address designated in writing by the customer (1)23 or, if not so designated, to the customer's last known 24 address, indicating that the marine business intends to 25 terminate all rights, title and interest in the boat or any 26 related equipment by operation of law under this subchapter. 27 If the marine business is sending a notice to the customer pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. § 7324 (relating to notification by 28 29 watercraft trailer dealer), it may send the notice required by this paragraph in the same mailing. The notice shall 30

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1 contain:

2 (i) The name, address and telephone number of the3 marine business.

4 (ii) A description of the boat, including make,
5 model and year, and the hull identification number, a
6 registration number or temporary decal number.

7

(iii) A description of any related equipment.

8 (iv) Notice that the marine business intends to 9 terminate the owner's and lienholder's rights, title and 10 interest in the boat and any related equipment by 11 operation of law under this subchapter.

(v) The amount which must be paid to the marine
business to redeem the boat and any related equipment as
of the date of the notice.

15 To the commission indicating that the marine (2) business intends to terminate all rights, title and interest 16 17 in the boat or any related equipment by operation of law 18 under this subchapter. This notice shall be accompanied by a 19 fee of \$50 or as otherwise established by the commission in 20 accordance with section 322.1 (relating to power to set fees) 21 and shall be on a form prescribed by the commission. 22 Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
